End of School Session 2021-2022 Update

Dear Parent / Carer,

As we approach the end of the academic year, I wanted to write to you to offer my sincere thanks for all your continued support. The letter will also contain an update of events which have taken place this term and provide some important information regarding our return in August.

Events this Term

Since I last wrote to you at Easter a lot has happened within our school community. It has been pleasing to see several large-scale events returning this term such as our S6 Charity Day, Leavers Ceremony, YPI, Sports and Fun Day, P7 Induction Days, Buddy Training, Prom and of course the school show, Oliver!

These events have been welcomed by all and it was especially pleasing to be able to welcome you back into the building for these; I enjoyed having the opportunity to meet with you. Planning for next session is well underway and we hope to have many more 'in-person' events within the school as we look to continue to build on the strong community relationships which already exist in Trinity HS. Improvement Planning and Standards and Quality

As part of our commitment to 'achieve excellence together' we have been reflecting as a school community on all our successes and achievements in the past year. A Microsoft Sway and pdf publication outlining these will be shared online and a link sent to yourself via Satchel One.

Over the past few months pupils in all year groups have had the opportunity, either through the Pupil Council or Senior Phase Inductions, to comment on our improvement priorities. We have also spent time discussing these at staff meetings and with the Parent Council. The improvement plan (Year 2) will be formed based on all this feedback and will be published early in the new session. A link for this will be sent to yourself via Satchel One. This year we have also consulted pupils on our 'participatory budget' and based on their feedback we will allocate a sum of our core school budget to the improvements identified by pupils during this process.











SQA 2022

This session saw the return of the SQA Examinations. Invigilators visiting the school were very complimentary of the pupil engagement and how well-mannered and polite our pupils were when asked to follow specific instructions. The SQA will publish results on Tuesday 9th August; pupils can sign up to alerts from 'MySQA' and receive their results by text messaging (they still receive a certificate in the post on the 9th August).
