CLASSIFICATION FOR SESSION 19/20

Our staffing allocation for next session should be finalised soon. As soon as this information is with me, I will be working with the extended management team to consider class groups & deployment of teaching staff for next session. Parents will be advised of their child's class & teacher before the end of term.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

Thank you very much to all the parents who took the time to comment on the work of our school, with the form attached to our last newsletter. Your thoughts & opinions are very important especially at this time of year when we, as a school community, are formulating a School Improvement Plan outlining our priorities for the next year. Staff and children are regularly involved in evaluating the work of the school in an effort to ensure positive changes are made when required.

HOME TO SCHOOL TRANSPORT

Each year Renfrewshire Council staff at HQ spend a considerable amount of time in August and September trying to establish accurate numbers of children who are travelling/should be travelling on school contract vehicles. This is largely due to some parents who have not applied for home to school transport for their children when transferring from primary to secondary. Parents often do not realise that they have to apply at transfer and pupils in some cases will use the transport when they are not allowed to do so. This can lead to overcrowding on vehicles and causes a delay in the issuing of privilege passes to non-entitled pupils.

With this in mind, I urge Primary 7 parents to complete an online application. This can be made by searching school transport on the council website www.renfrewshire.gov.uk. This will take you straight to a link for the online application form. The transport eligibility address list is also available online where you can check if your address qualifies.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

As in previous years, I thought it might be helpful to issue a reminder of our agreed school dress code at this time of the year, as many parents will be purchasing new items of clothing for the new session.

In St. Charles' Primary School, parents are asked to provide their children with the following items of school uniform:

- ☐ Grey shorts/trousers/skirt, white shirt, white polo shirt, school tie, grey pullover/sweatshirt/cardigan, grey blazer with badge.
- ☐ On gym days it is helpful for children to wear white polo shirts instead of white shirt & tie

During the months between the beginning of May and the end of September, parents may dress their children in the summer uniform. This is optional and will very much be dictated by the weather. The summer uniform is:

- ☐ Grey shorts, white polo shirt for boys
- ☐ Blue gingham dress for girls

Please note blazers with coloured braiding or checked/plaid skirts/pinafores are not school uniform. I would ask parents to support the school and not to purchase such items. Local retailers have been advised that these are not in accordance with our agreed school dress code.

Children should wear black shorts, white polo/tee-shirt and sandshoes or training shoes during PE lessons. In the interests of health & safety, of both individual and others present, all jewellery must be removed before taking part in physical education lessons or physical activities. This includes swimming lessons in Primary 6. **All items of clothing should be clearly marked with your child's name.**

BREAKFAST CLUB

The children who currently attend the breakfast club can continue to do so. Any vacancies arising because of P7 children transferring to high school are balloted for new P1 children and children on the waiting list. If your child/children currently has a place, which will not be required, please advise Mrs Winters or school office at your earliest convenience. This allows the place to be allocated to another child who needs it. The cost next session will continue to be £1 daily per child and is payable directly to Mrs Winters at the club either daily or weekly. An application form for a place may be requested at any time from the school office and your child's name can be placed on the waiting list, which is reviewed annually.

POPE FRANCIS FAITH AWARD

The P7 children who have completed the work towards achieving the PFFA have had their work sent to the Scottish Catholic Education Service for verification. Children who are successful in achieving the standard will be presented with the award at the P7 Leavers Mass on Monday 17th June at 7pm in St Charles' Church. P6 children involved will continue to work towards the award next session.

BIG THANKS

Thank you to all who attended last Friday's event, which was a big success. I am sure you will agree it was a very well organised event by our Parent Council & volunteers, who responded to the weather and provided fun activities in the hall. I would like to acknowledge the hard work of our Parent Council and thank all the volunteers involved for their hard work & commitment especially in the fundraising they undertake as all children benefit greatly from it. A special thank you to Raymond Quinn (Chairperson) for his continuous commitment in co-ordinating the work of our very active Parent Council.

This session Parent Council money raised helped meet the cost of new gym equipment. It also paid for new albs for First Communicants, helped to furnish class libraries, and our new Tranquillity Den, and will also contribute towards new technology, including a new PA system.

I would also like to acknowledge the hard work of Miss Leck and the pupils of the Fundraising Citizenship Group as they have co-ordinated all our charitable fundraising this year and in total have raised £1477.22
