#### SCHOOLS UPDATE

All nursery and P1-3 children returned to school on Monday 22nd February 2021, with home learning continuing for our children in P4-7. We currently have 3 hubs operational for P4-7 children, could I please ask that parents keep the school office informed of work rotas as the children should only attend this when there is no alternative childcare.

The First Minister was quite clear in her announcement that the return to school for P1-3 did not signal a wider easing of restrictions and the '**stay at home**' message remains very much in place.

The return of the P1-3 children will be monitored over the next few weeks to assess the impact on community transmission of the new more infectious variants. It is vital, as a school community, we do all in our power to minimise the opportunities for transmission and keep everyone associated with our school as safe as possible. In doing this we have the best chance to see our P4-7 children return soon (possible date 15th March).

As our P1-3 children return the COVID-19 mitigations that were in place before we broke up in December will continue. Including:

- Strict social distancing for adults
- Only one adult per family accompanies/collects our P1-3 children.
- Adults are still required to wear a face-covering at the school gates.

All parents were sent a Parent Guide with more details. Please let the school know if you were not sent the link and we will check our contact details for you.

#### COMMUNICATION

For P1-3 parents, could I ask that any correspondence returns to the normal lines of communication. E.G. Calls to the school office or emails via the school enquiries. Messages sent via Seesaw will not be seen by teachers outwith school hours.

For Primary 4-7 parents Class teachers will be available during working hours via Seesaw or Google Classrooms. We will update parents through text, the School App and the School Blog.
