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### CLASSIFICATION FOR SESSION 21/22

Our staffing allocation for next session should be finalised soon. As soon as this information is with me, I will be working with the extended management team to consider class groups & deployment of teaching staff for next session. Parents will be advised of their child's class & teacher before the end of term.

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### SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

Thank you very much to the 64 parents who took the time to give their views in our parental Survey. Your thoughts & opinions are very important especially at this time of year when we, as a school community, are formulating a School Improvement Plan outlining our priorities for the next year. Staff and children are regularly involved in evaluating the work of the school to ensure positive changes are made when required.

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### HOME TO SCHOOL TRANSPORT SCHOOL LEAVERS

Each year Renfrewshire Council staff at HQ spend a considerable amount of time in August and September trying to establish accurate numbers of children who are travelling/should be travelling on school contract vehicles. This is largely due to some parents who have not applied for home to school transport for their children when transferring from primary to secondary. Parents often do not realise that they have to apply at transfer and pupils in some cases will use the transport when they are not allowed to do so. This can lead to overcrowding on vehicles and causes a delay in the issuing of privilege passes to non-entitled pupils.

With this in mind, I urge Primary 7 parents to complete an online application. This can be made by searching school transport on the council website [www.renfrewshire.gov.uk](http://www.renfrewshire.gov.uk). This will take you straight to a link for the online application form. The transport eligibility address list is also available online where you can check if your address qualifies.

**P7 children will get an opportunity to visit St Andrew's Academy on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> June in the afternoon. They will go to the High School by bus and get a welcome and a tour of the school.**

### SCHOOL BUS/FACE COVERINGS

Children must wear a face covering on school transport. Please make sure your child has a face covering if they travel on the school bus, or if they are going on a school trip.

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### SCHOOL UNIFORM

I thought it might be helpful to issue a reminder of our agreed school dress code at this time, as many parents will be purchasing new items of clothing for the new session. We will still be operating a more relaxed uniform in August, as we do not know what the restrictions will be at that time. The relaxed uniform is

- White polo shirt or white T shirt, black leggings, joggers or shorts.

As part of our relaxed uniform we are looking into purchasing tracksuits with a school badge. We will give more information soon with prices etc and we will contact parents to see if this would be of interest.

Parents can also dress children in the formal uniform if they prefer.

- Grey shorts/trousers/skirt, white shirt, white polo shirt, school tie, grey pullover/sweatshirt/cardigan, grey blazer with badge.

**Please note blazers with coloured braiding or checked/plaid skirts/pinafores are not school uniform. I would ask parents to support the school and not to purchase such items. Local retailers have been advised that these are not in accordance with our agreed school dress code.**

**All items of clothing should be clearly marked with your child's name.**

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### SCHOOL LUNCH MENU

There will be a new school lunch menu from Monday 14<sup>th</sup> June. **Please note there will be no sandwich option.** Children will be going to the school canteen from Monday 14<sup>th</sup> June. The last meeting of St Charles' Primary School Parent Hub will take place on Microsoft Teams on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> June at 6.30pm. All parents/carers are welcome to attend. Our Parent Hub are currently working hard to organise a few surprises for our P7 leavers! Thank you to the Parent Hub for all their support over the last year.

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### BREAKFAST CLUB

We will give parents more information about the Breakfast Club as soon as we can. The numbers we have attending our breakfast club make it difficult for us to operate with restrictions still in place.

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### ANNUAL SPORTS DAY

Our sports day will take place on **Tuesday 8th June**. Active Schools coaches and pupil leaders from St Andrew's Academy will support children in different sporting activities during the day. All children should bring a water bottle to school that day to allow water consumption during the day. There will be a Parent Hub tuckshop selling a set snack available for £1 per child. The snack will be a drink, an ice lolly and crisps. Children can bring £1 to school, or snacks from home.

Parents will not be able to attend at this time. We will take plenty of photos to put on Seesaw or Google Classrooms.

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REMINDER  
SAFER SCHOOL PILOT

As you will be aware, the 'Safer Schools' pilot began on Monday 19 April and some streets outside the school are not to be used by cars during restricted times – namely at the start and the end of the school day.

This means that on weekdays during the school term, between 8.30am-9.15am and 2.30pm-3.15pm, no vehicles will be allowed in Rowan Street and part of Thrushcraigs Crescent – except those with an exemption. **This is for parking and driving in the street.**

Exemptions are in place for residents in the restricted streets and school staff through a permit scheme, as well as automatic exemptions for the emergency services, including doctors on call, district nurses, carers and support workers, postal service vehicles, school buses and transport vehicles, school contract taxis and blue badge holders dropping their child off or residing at or visiting a property in the restricted street.

The pilot aims to improve safety at the school gates, reduce congestion and emissions, and encourage active travel for our parents, carers and pupils on their daily commute by walking, wheeling or cycling to school instead of driving.

If you do need to drive, please park safely away from the school gates and walk the final part of their journey.

An experimental traffic regulation order (ETRO) is in place for the duration of the pilot and Police Scotland will be able to issue Fixed Penalty Notices for anyone found driving in these streets during the restricted times without a valid exemption.
