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### QUALITY ASSURANCE VISIT

Our school will be visited on Tuesday this week by two senior officers from Renfrewshire Council Children's Services who will observe learning and chatting to children about their learning opportunities in school. The Pupil Leadership Group will be welcoming the visitors & giving them a tour of our school. Remember to ask your child if they had a visitor to their classroom and if they were involved in any activities with them.

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### WORLD HAEMOPHILIA DAY – Friday 25<sup>th</sup> April

All pupils are invited to wear something RED to school on this date and donate £1 which we will gift to The Haemophilia Scotland Society (UK). This is a charity we like to support annually as we have a pupil in our school who suffers from Haemophilia; a serious bleeding disorder for which there is no known cure. Information on the condition and the impact it can have will be shared at pupil assemblies that week. Donations can be paid on parent pay, a link will be sent out for this.

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### SPIRITUAL LIFE OF OUR SCHOOL

Father Jim invites the P4 children who will be receiving the sacraments of Reconciliation & Holy Eucharist this year to attend 10.00am mass each Sunday morning in St Charles' Church for 4 weeks to take part in "Do This in Memory of Me", a programme of spiritual preparation.

On Weds 12<sup>th</sup> March P4 children from all St Andrew's Academy associated primary schools will all be tuning in to an online, interactive Lenten assembly with Fr Ryan from St Mirin's Cathedral.

Primary 4 children will be taking part in "The Travelling Rosary" and each child will receive a set of Rosary beads gifted to the school by The Catenian Association. More information will be issued to P4 learners.

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### BIKEABILITY TRAINING

Primary 7 children are being invited to take part in Bikeability training beginning on w/c Monday the 28th of April. More information will be issued to P7 parents.

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### SHARING YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING

This month there are evening sessions focussed on bedtime books & storytelling for P2 children and parents. After the Easter holidays we will be hosting FAB CLUB as we have done for many years. This is a family learning offer hosted by class teachers at the end of the school day. The club ordinarily runs one day each week for 6-8 weeks and is funded using Pupil Equity Fund money which is allocated to the school each year by Scottish Government. More information will be issued.

We have been piloting the Just2Easy platform since August for Home learning, but children & parents were finding it hard to navigate & access posts. We saw a decline in the number of children submitting completed tasks which also made it unpopular with staff. As a result, I am delighted to report we have been able to reintroduce SeeSaw in Primaries 1-3 classes only to share classroom learning & issue home learning activities. This is in direct response to parent feedback. We had hoped to secure SeeSaw for all classes as it was so popular but just didn't have the money to do so. The license for P1-3 is costing approx £2500. The current arrangement of using Microsoft Teams will continue in Primaries 4-7.

## HOME LEARNING

We were able to use Seesaw last week to share photos taken at the P7 residential trip at Dumfries House. This allowed families at home to receive regular daily updates and some "real-time" updates too.

As previously advised, we have spent £13,506.69 on introducing a new reading resource (Collins BIG CAT) across the school this year. As this was such a big financial investment, we took the difficult decision that these core reading books would not be sent home with children as historically many books issued for homework are not returned. Children have the opportunity to choose a book for enjoyment each week if they wish to do so. Teachers particularly those in the early stages were keen that the core reading books be provided for reading at home and sharing with parents and I appreciate many parents felt the same.

I am delighted to advise I have been able to purchase a licence for Collins ebooks which means all of the core readers will now be available in digital format for your child to access at home. Class teachers will issue information this week on how this can be done.

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## OUTDOOR LEARNING

In St Charles' Primary we believe in the statement attributed to the author Alfred Wainwright, ***"There's no such thing as bad weather, only unsuitable clothing."*** With this in mind we would ask that all children attend school each day wearing suitable footwear & clothing to permit outdoor learning in all weathers. If any parent ever needs help with uniform, jackets or footwear please ask at the school office. We would be happy to help.

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## HEALTH LIFESTYLES

Please remember if your child is bringing a refillable bottle to school each day this should be filled with water only. A small number of children are bringing bottles filled with juice. This has no nutritional benefit but more worryingly if it is sipped throughout the day this can cause tooth decay & encourage dental cavities to develop. We are promoting children's Health & Wellbeing in a number of different ways in our school & would strongly discourage the drinking of juice except if taken as part of a child's lunch.
