Other Curriculum Areas	Use artists Miro, Klee and Kandinsky as an inspiration for your own piece of art.	Write a poem or acrostic for LENT. Or say an extra special prayer before bed time throughout Lent.	Research and make a list of the changes we see in nature as we move from seasons winter to spring.	Make a model from materials of your choice and bring it in to Show and Tell. Explain your choices to the class.
Family Activities	Tuesday 5th March is Shrove Tuesday – make some pancakes with your family. Why not try some different toppings on them? Can you rewrite the recipe?	Ash Wednesday marks the start of Lent. Find out some facts about Lent and share these with your family. Have you made any Lenten promises? Try to keep them!	Play a game with your family members. This could be a board game, card game, outdoor game – whatever you choose!	World Book Day – Thursday 7th March Talk to someone at home about their favourite books/stories from their childhood. Share your favourite stories and read them together.
