Reading	Discuss likes and dislikes about your book	What puzzles you about your book?	What connections can you make between your book and the real world	
Literacy & Modern Foreign Languages	At home, find all the different ways you could use your BOOST to help you if you had a problem spelling a word. Write down as many ways as you can find.	Ask someone at home to write out a sentence missing capital letters and full stops, can you try and edit their sentence to include these?	Using your listening and talking skills, tell someone at home about what you would most like to learn about this year in school. Try and make a note of this and we could possibly learn about it later in the year.	When lining up in school, Mr Kerr counts up in Spanish to check we are all there. Revise your counting in Spanish Skills upto 20.
Numeracy	Using our skills of writing out numbers in letters that we have been practicing, try to write out eight numbers in full written form (only numbers up to 100)	Test your counting skills, counting up in 5's, 10's, 20's etc from any random number e.g. 512, 517, 522 etc. Do you notice any patterns in your counting?	Challenge someone to give you numbers up to 999, can you identify what is the hundreds, tens and units?	Have someone at home write some numbers upto the value of 999, place these numbers in order from smallest to biggest.
Other Curriculum Areas	Can you create your own mini fact sheets about Ancient Egypt? Use any resource you can to help your group create their Ancient Egypt poster.	27 th September is the feast of St Vincent de Paul. Can you find out why he is such an important figure in the catholic church?	In Paths, we have been learning about our feelings. Can you draw a picture of yourself feeling happy, around your picture, can you write all the things that make you happy?	If you have any cardboard boxes lying about the house, can you bring them into school so we can create some egyptian artwork.
Family Activities	Make up a story about someone going back to school after the summer. Get someone at home to contribute to the story. Write it down or make it into a comic strip or draw a picture to represent the story.	Work out the total age of all members of your family – can you include brothers and sisters? Parents? Grandparents? Aunts, uncles and cousins? Any other family members? Make a list and find the total.	Imagine we were opening a brand new school – what would our uniform be like? What would you like to wear? Design a new school uniform.	Watch a new tv programme with some of your family members. Discuss your favourite characters or events. What do you think will happen next? Will you watch it again?
