Numeracy	Play "What's the Missing Number" Have someone write out the tables but leave some numbers missing. e.g, x 6= 42 ,or 5x5= You fill in the blanks.	Practice writing Tenths as a fraction and as a decimal fraction. e.g. $\underline{1} = 0.1$ $\underline{10}$ Partition a range of whole numbers and decimal fractions to one and two decimal places. E.g. 3.6= 3 ones and 6 tenths= 36 tenths.	Without a calculator Practice multiplying and dividing 3 and 4 digit numbers with remainders. You can use partitioning to help you.	Keep up your work in addition (with carrying) and subtraction (with borrowing), using 3-5 digit numbers. Eg 4679 + <u>3897</u>
