Literacy & Modern Foreign Languages	Write a list of as many festivals that you know. Can you tell someone a little about each? Can you find out any more information?	Halloween is now over for another year. Write at least 1 paragraph about the spookiest thing that happened to you this Halloween? You must include adjectives to enhance your recall of the event.	St Andrew's Day is at the end of this month and he is very important to Scotland. Can you find out why?	Tell someone at home about the spooky story you created in school. Tell them about what gave you the inspiration and how you would improve it for next time.
Numeracy	Talk with someone at home about multiplication and times tables, can you learn more about your 2 times table?	Using numbers you see around you, whether it is page numbers, road signs or anything else, create your own adding and subtracting sums up to 1000.	Counting in steps: Using 2's, 5's 10's start at a random number e.g 6, and count up in a step method, why not change half way through to add greater challenge.	Adding 10's together. E.g 20+40=60, 70+30=100. Try only up to 100 to start but if we are wanting extra challenge try to 1000.

Discuss what I have been learning in my recorder lessons in school. Can you names some of the musical notes you have learned?	November in the church is the month of remembrance. Discuss a person who meant a lot to you and has passed away. Complete a November list that we can place on our Sacred Space in the classroom.	To carry out some research on the patron Saint of Scotland, St Andrew, whose feast day is on 30 th November.
