
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Head Teacher's note

St Benedict's Cluster

One of our core school values is Community. For us, this starts here in St David's Primary school with our pupils, staff and families in our local area. However we are also privileged to be part of a much bigger extended family within the St Benedict's Cluster. The cluster is made up of our school, St Margaret's Primary School, St Anthony's Primary School, Our Lady of Peace Primary School, St Fillan's Primary School and our associated secondary school, St Benedict's.

Having a sense of belonging is a human need, just like the need for food and shelter. A sense of belonging to an extended community improves motivation, health and happiness and it can enhance our effort, sense of achievement and engagement in our school and community. As such, we would like to ensure that all members of our schools' communities feel part of the wider St Benedict's cluster community (nursery, primary and secondary schools jointly). To support us with achieving this, our cluster are currently undertaking a very short and simple survey for all of our pupils, staff and families.
