See who can guess the most shapes correctly.	Ask a grown up to write numbers 0-20 on pieces of paper and hide them around a room or garden. Go on a hunt for the numbers, naming each one as you find them.	Collect items from your outdoor space and create a nature number line. Eg. One stick, two stones, three flowers, 4 leaves.	Design your own symetrical Christmas jumper.
Other Curriculum Areas	Can you make a new sleigh for Santa? Think carefully about what you will need. You could join an empty box and kitchen roll tubes with sticky tape. Can you decorate the sleigh afterwards with paint, colouring pens or stickers?	Draw a picture of the Nativity scene. Be sure to include everyone who was there.	Practice your lines for our Nativity show.	Design your own Christmas tree. Remember to include bright lights, decorations and maybe even some tinsel too! Will you have a star or an angel on the top?
Family Activities	We would usually host our Jingle Bell Mile in December with our school community. Why not find a time with your family, put on your Santa hats and choose a route in the local community to spread some Christmas Cheer.	In the current circumstances, some of the residents in our local community have less visitors than usual, can you spread some kindness and create them a Christmas Card — bring it to school and we will post them on.	During December, we celebrate Advent which is a time of preparation. Could you prepare by joining in with mass online from Fr Paul?	This month can you investigate ice — outside or inside.
