


As a community of faith and learning, we embody the spirit of pilgrimage. We journey together, with shared aims and an ethos strong in Catholicity. We are blessed to have St Margaret of Scotland as our patron saint. She is the perfect role model for our pupils when we consider the theme of Catholic Education Week- Pilgrims of Faith. Margaret had a strong influence over her husband and together they lived with their eight children as a devout and faithful Catholic family. Together they prayed, fed the hungry, and offered a powerful example of living faith in action. Margaret used her influence to shape the church and she encouraged people to live a devout life, grow in prayer, and grow in holiness. This gives greater clarity to one of our school values: 'We follow Jesus,' as St Margaret is a fantastic example of this.

It was Bishop John who suggested that Jesus himself feature in our aims, he spoke of the sacrifice that God made, sending his beloved son to live as one of us. Bishop John stated that he felt that Jesus was most relatable to the children, as young learners, growing in faith. Jesus, at one point in his life, was the same age that our children are now. This is quite a thought for our young learners: Did he play football with his friends? Did Mary and Joseph ever have to give Jesus a row? Did Jesus have any pets?

When they think of Jesus being a boy, living here on earth, they think of him in awe and wonder.

Therefore, it is of utmost importance to their faith formation, that they learn about Jesus and the example he set for us. We use the Motto from Pope Francis's Laudato Si encyclical as our motto in school- Live Wisely, Think Deeply, Love Generously. The children understand this as living like Jesus. Each week, at our assembly, every teacher chooses a child who they have witnessed keeping our values. The scope for praise is huge so the children know that they are not just being rewarded for educational endeavors- they can be rewarded for being kind to someone, sharing their snack, sorting a problem, caring for our school pet, showing good manners, helping a friend. The list is endless. And all these reasons are related back to our value- We follow Jesus.

As we prepare our children to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation, we lead them on a journey of faith discovery. We share stories of Jesus that illustrate the importance of the Sacraments that they are preparing to receive. We don't just teach this in P4 and P7, we teach every week from the beginning of Primary 1 'til the end of Primary 7. Our aim is to build a solid faith foundation, supporting the children to be confident in their own faith, to understand what it means to be a young Catholic, to have Jesus in their hearts so that they come to rely on their faith, and it becomes meaningful to them. They journey with us through primary school as pilgrims of faith.



Pope Francis said: "Pilgrimage is a symbol of life. It makes us think of life as walking, as a path. If a person does not walk, but instead stays still, this is not useful; it accomplishes nothing. Think of water: when water is not in the river, it does not course, but instead it remains still and stagnates. A soul that does not walk in life doing good, doing many things that one must do for society, to assist others, or who does not walk through life seeking God and inspiration from the Holy Spirit, is a soul that finishes in mediocrity and in spiritual poverty. Please: do not stand still in life!"



St. Fillan's Primary School

Journeying in Faith Together

As a Catholic School, one of the most important values that we hold is the value of Faith. In St. Fillan's Primary, we are a faith community who support and encourage one another to live the kind of life that Jesus asks of us.

How do we answer God's Call as 'Pilgrims of Faith?'

In our school, we have six core values that guide our thoughts, actions and words. These values are: Faith, Respect, Responsibility, Trust, Teamwork and Success. Kindness is our guiding value which underpins all that we do.

Each month, we shine a spotlight on a particular school and Gospel value. During Assemblies, we discuss how we can live by these values in our everyday lives, and we consider what this would look like and sound like.

During the month of November, 'Faith' has been the core school value that we have explored along with 'Kindness' as the Gospel value of focus. As a school community, we have



united in prayer to remember those who have gone before us by participating in a whole school prayer service at the Grotto in St. Fillan's Church. We have demonstrated 'Kindness' by raising over £250 for the MND (Motor Neurone Disease) charity by hosting a community Fairtrade Coffee morning. Our Primary 4 and Primary 7 have celebrated their 'Mass of Commitment' and 'Mass of Enrolment' where they have made a public pledge to honour the way, the life and the truth of Jesus Christ.

Called to be Saints:



We believe that everyone has the capacity to be a Saint and we encourage our children to demonstrate Saint like qualities as they live their daily lives.

Our Primary 7 children have recently researched the lives of the Saints that have inspired them to be the best version of themselves. They have explored the lives of many holy men and women who have served God and demonstrated great faith in him. As a result, the children have selected the names of the Saints whom they will pray to and ask for

guidance as they continue to prepare for their Sacrament of Confirmation. Through our Sacramental preparation in Primaries 4, 6 and 7, we continue on our journey of faith as we bear witness to Jesus and draw ourselves closer to him.

Prayer and Worship:

We have a very close relationship with Monsignor Andrew McFadden, and we plan many events throughout the session to join together as a School and Parish family to pray and worship together.

We attend First Friday Masses in the Church, and our children take leadership roles as they prepare and facilitate many parts of the Mass including, Altar Serving, Reading, singing and preparing music. Our families join with us along with the Parishioners to share in this community of faith.

During the month of October, we enjoyed visits to the Grotto to pray the Rosary for our own special intentions as well as the intentions of his Holy Father, the Pope. Our weekly whole school Assemblies are anchored in opportunities for community prayer, and we discuss the learning within the Sunday Gospel and consider how we can replicate it's teaching into our own everyday lives.

Deepening our Beliefs:



We have the opportunity on a weekly basis to deepen our

faith and beliefs through participation in the 'Developing in Faith' religious programme. We benefit from having a safe and supportive space to ask questions and deepen our understanding of faith by working collaboratively.

We reach out to one another and to those who most need our help in a variety of ways. Our children demonstrate the value of 'kindness' which is our motivation to help others. **Being Part of a Family:**



We consider ourselves to be a family within our school and as such, we have a shared responsibility to look out for one another and help each other in any way we can.

Our Primary 7 children are excellent 'Big Buddies' to our Primary one children and our Primary 6 children have engaged in a 'Play Leaders' programme in partnership with Active Schools to learn how to

encourage younger child to play in harmony with one another and to compromise when things are not going their way.

As 'Pilgrims of Faith,' we understand that we are on a journey. It may be an arduous one, faced with many trials and tribulations, but by listening to God's word, responding to his call, praying, worshipping, growing in understanding, serving and supporting one another, we can stand united and share in the promise that one day we will be united with Jesus in Heaven.

Our faith continues to grow day by day and it keeps us strong. It gives us the confidence and strength to continue, even when things are tough and challenges present.

During Catholic Education Week, we will continue to pray to the Holy Spirit for strength and guidance to support all Catholic schools on their journey as 'Pilgrims of Faith.'

Our Lady of Peace Primary

We take comfort in our Sacred Spaces in class and the protected time we offer each day to prayer.



We believe our school promotes our value of excellence by encouraging everyone in our school community to be the best they can be. Jesus provides us with an eternal truth, on which we




can build our school's vision, values and aims, and on which our young people can depend throughout school and beyond.

A CHARTER for CATHOLIC SCHOOLS in SCOTLAND

The mission of the Catholic school is to develop as a community of faith and learning, providing the highest quality of education, and offering formation through the promotion of Gospel values, through celebration and worship, and through service to the common good.

All Catholic schools in Scotland, in honouring Jesus Christ as the Way, the Truth and the Life, will feature the following characteristics:

- a commitment to the integrated education and formation of the whole person, in close partnership with parents as the first educators of their children;
- an inclusive ethos which aims to honour the life, dignity and voice of each person, made in the image of God;
- a commitment to the search for wisdom in life and to the pursuit of excellence, through the development of each person's unique God-given talents;
- a commitment to the spiritual formation of the school community, through the shared experience of prayer and liturgy, and in partnership with local parishes;
- * the provision of religious education programmes which will enable young people to develop their understanding of Gospel values and of how to apply them to life;
- a commitment to uphold the moral teaching, faith tradition and sacramental life of the Catholic Church;
- a commitment to communicate Catholic social teaching and thereby to promote social justice and opportunity for all;
- * a commitment to ecumenical action and the unity of Christians;
- * the promotion of respect for different beliefs and cultures and for inter-faith dialogue;
- * a commitment to support the continuing professional and spiritual development of staff.

All staff appointed to a Catholic school are expected to support and promote the

aims, mission, values and ethos of the school, as illustrated in this Charter.
