#### **Nut Allergies**



We are a nut free zone as we have children with a severe nut allergy which, for these children contact with someone who may have eaten nuts could be **FATAL**. Please always check the ingredients of your child's snack and lunch. I would ask for your cooperation and ensure that there are no nuts brought into school for snack or lunch. Please note that these ingredients can be found in chocolate spread, biscuits, cereal bars etc. Please always check the ingredients.

### **Religious Life of the School**

Tuesday the 1<sup>st</sup> of November is the Feast of All Saints, this is a Holy Day of Obligation, and the school will be attending Mass in St Fergus' at 10:30am. Everyone is welcome to attend. During the Month of November, we have Catholic Education Fortnight from the Feast of St Margaret of Scotland, 16<sup>th</sup> November, to the Feast of St Andrew, 30<sup>th</sup> November. This year the theme is 'Communion, Participation, Mission'. Further Information about Education Sunday Mass, 20<sup>th</sup> November, will be issued soon.

Our Next Family Mass is on our Feast Day, Friday 25<sup>th</sup> November at 9:30am followed by Tea and Coffee back in the school, everyone is welcome.

#### **Sacramental Preparation**

Those children in Primaries 3, 4 and 7 who will receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, the Holy Eucharist and Confirmation will be receiving an information leaflet shortly from Mrs Rowley. During our Feast Day Mass those children wishing to receive the Sacraments will be officially enrolled and make a commitment to the preparation at this Mass, we are asking that Parents to attend this Mass. Mrs Rowley and Father John will be available during our parents' nights, 16<sup>th</sup>/17<sup>th</sup> November to answer questions about the Sacraments.

# Laudato Si Update



Our Laudato Si group have decided to focus on reducing litter, recycling and promoting our Faith. To reduce litter, we would like to reintroduce 'Wrapper Free Wednesdays'. On Wednesdays we are asking children and staff to bring in a snack that doesn't have a wrapper. This could be a piece of fruit or something stored in a reusable tub. We think this will reduce litter in our playground. We are also recycling batteries. If you have any old batteries at home, bring them to

school and we will make sure they are recycled safely.

#### **School Attendance**

This is extremely important to ensure all children are given an equal chance of grasping every learning opportunity available to them. It has been a struggle since the covid pandemic to have strong school attendance. St. Fergus' has always been a school which has encouraged children to attend, however, since March 2020, our figures have dropped quite significantly. # Registration for a Primary 1 place August 2023

Children who reach 5 years of age between 1 March 2023 and 29 February 2024, should be registered for education in their catchment school. The registration will start on Tuesday 1 and close on Friday 4 November 2022. You will be able to register online. If you, or someone you're helping, can't register online, phone your catchment school and make an appointment to register in person during the registration dates.

If you miss the registration dates for Primary 1 (P1) for classes starting in August 2023, contact your catchment school.

Children must be enrolled for school using the name which appears on the birth certificate, which must be produced at the time of registration.










# Who Responded?








How Confident do you feel in keeping your children safe online?

#### **Free School Meal Entitlement**

The Scottish Government introduced free school meals to all children in Primary 5 in January, which means that all children in Primary 1-5 now receive free school meals. Our new school lunch menus are available to view on our website by following this link:

The plan is to introduce free meals to children in Primary 6 & 7 in August 2022. We are still encouraging all families to apply for free school meals (if they think they are entitled, see the information below) as currently there are additional payments being made by Renfrewshire Council to cover the cost of this entitlement over holidays.

#### Are You Getting What You Are Entitled To?

#### **Free School Meals**

Your child may be entitled to free school meals if:

- Your child attends a Renfrewshire school or has been placed in an educational establishment outside Renfrewshire-by-Renfrewshire Council, or;
- You receive income support, any income-related element of employment and support allowance, maximum working tax credits (if you earn less than £6,420/year), child tax credit only (if you earn less than £16,190) or pension credit

#### **Clothing Grants**

Parents or carers of children attending Renfrewshire primary, secondary or additional support needs schools during the school session who satisfy the financial conditions are eligible to apply for free school meals and/or clothing grants. A clothing grant is a payment made by Renfrewshire Council to qualifying parents or carers to assist with the purchase of school uniforms. For session 2020-2021, the level of clothing grant is £100 per eligible pupil. A maximum of one grant will be paid for each child during any school year.
