School Attendance

In December, parents/carers of children who are below 90% attendance for Term 1 will be issued with an advisory letter. Should you receive one I would ask that you consider this as we have a long way to go before the end of the school year and your child will have the ability to increase their attendance. So Far this year 16% of our children have had holiday and the total number of school days lost is 121. Please think carefully when you are booking a holiday within the school term. By the end of the school year we would like all children in St. Fergus to be above 95%. See below for some important facts:

Why is attendance at school and punctuality important? Because every second counts.

90% attendance may sound good. However, this is the equivalent of missing a half day of schooling EACH WEEK.

If this continues over every five years a child spends at school, a child with 90% attendance will miss HALF A YEAR'S schooling.

A child with 80% attendance will lose A FULL YEAR of schooling over the same period.

Did You Know?

A 2 week holiday during the school term means that the highest attendance your child can achieve is 94.7%

Did You Know?

If you are 15 minutes late each day you will have missed 2 full weeks of School in one year!!



Child Safety/Car Parking- Reminder

Could I also ask that you leave the playground as soon as you have your child/children, this is to enable the 'Out of School Care' Staff are able to complete a final headcount prior to walking to Glencoats Primary.

- No Parking on the yellow zigzags

Free School Meals

Your child may be entitled to free school meals if:

- Your child attends a Renfrewshire school or has been placed in an educational establishment outside Renfrewshire-by-Renfrewshire Council, or;
- You receive income support, any income-related element of employment and support allowance, maximum working tax credits (if you earn less than £6,420/year), child tax credit only (if you earn less than £16,190) or pension credit

Should your application be accepted Free School Meal payments are made during school holidays.

Who will get the payments:


If your child is in P6 or P7 and they get free school meals on the basis of low income (family on certain benefits), you'll get the payment automatically.

If your child gets a school meal because they are in primary 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5, you'll only get the payment if:

- they're entitled to a free school meal on the basis of low income (family on certain benefits)
- you've applied for free school meals for this school year (August 2023 to June 2024).

Clothing Grants

Parents or carers of children attending Renfrewshire primary, secondary or additional support needs schools during the school session who satisfy the financial conditions are eligible to apply for free school meals and/or clothing grants. A clothing grant is a payment made by Renfrewshire Council to qualifying parents or carers to assist with the purchase of school uniforms. For session 2023-2024, the level of clothing grant is


£120 per eligible pupil. This year there is an extra winter payment of £50 for each child receiving school clothing grant to help buy winter clothing. A maximum of one grant will be paid for each child during any school year.
