Child Safety/Car Parking- Reminder

Could I please remind all parents that in the morning our playground is a parent free zone and at the end of the school day it is only the Primary 1 and 2 parents who should enter the playground, this is to ensure that our younger children are collected by an adult. Could I also ask that you leave the playground as soon as you have your child/children, this is to enable the 'Out of School Care' Staff to complete a final headcount prior to walking to Glencoats Primary.

Recently we have had a number of complaints from our neighbours regarding the speed of cars in the morning and cars parked on Bankfoot Road. Could I please remind everyone of the following:

- No Parking on the yellow zigzags
- No Parking in front of our Neighbour's Driveways
- No Parking in the staff car park unless using the disabled space. This must be authorised by the school on proof of Blue Badge.
- No parking in the drop off bays at any time.
- Do not allow your children to exit your car at the entrance to the drop off zone.
- Please drive slowly entering and leaving the drop off zone as there could be children and parents crossing and, at times, cars leaving the staff car park.
- Please encourage both children and adults to use the school crossing.

Please inform anyone who drops off or collects your child/children of the reminders above in the interest of keeping everyone safe.

School Attendance- Key Facts

Why is attendance at school and punctuality important? Because every second counts.

90% attendance may sound good. However, this is the equivalent of missing a half day of schooling EACH WEEK.

If this continues **over every five years** a child spends at school, a child with **90%** attendance will miss **HALF A YEAR'S** schooling.

A child with 80% attendance will lose A FULL YEAR of schooling over the same period.



Did You Know?

A 2 week holiday during the school term means that the highest attendance your child can achieve is 94.7%



If you are 15 minutes late each day you will have missed 2 full weeks of School in one year!!

Last month our Spanish Ambassadors really enjoyed our Dia De Los Muertos celebrations. Each class worked really hard to contribute to a school ofrenda and everyone took part in a costume parade. We have been busy preparing for Christmas, and we are looking forward to planning fun activities to help us learn about Spanish Christmas traditions.



The Wellbeing Warriors have been creating posters to display around the school to promote the Happiness Heroes in the playground so that no one feels sad or lonely at playtime or lunchtime. They will be given a lanyard with their badge on to wear so that all children will know who they are and how they can help them feel safe and happy.



The Digital Leaders have been learning how to create a SWAY newsletter and plan to keep parents up to date with what is happening across the school. Our Leadership Group will be gathering information from our staff on all individual successes, for example: books being read, literacy and numeracy topics, who attended Hot Chocolate Friday and head teacher awards. Are You Getting What You Are Entitled To?

The Scottish Government provides free school meals to all children in Primary 1-5. Our new school lunch menus are available to view on Renfrewshire Council's Website by following this link:

Free School Meals

Your child may be entitled to free school meals if:

- Your child attends a Renfrewshire school or has been placed in an educational establishment outside Renfrewshire-by-Renfrewshire Council, or;
- You receive income support, any income-related element of employment and support allowance, maximum working tax credits (if you earn less than £6,420/year), child tax credit only (if you earn less than £16,190) or pension credit

Should your application be accepted Free School Meal payments are made during school holidays. Who will get the payments:

If your child is in P6 or P7 and they get free school meals on the basis of low income (family on certain benefits), you'll get the payment automatically.

If your child gets a school meal because they are in primary 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5, you'll only get the payment if:

- they're entitled to a free school meal on the basis of low income (family on certain benefits)
- you've applied for free school meals for this school year (August 2023 to June 2024).

Clothing Grants

Parents or carers of children attending Renfrewshire primary, secondary or additional support needs schools during the school session who satisfy the financial conditions are eligible to apply for free school meals and/or clothing grants. A clothing grant is a payment made by Renfrewshire Council to qualifying parents or carers to assist with the purchase of school uniforms. For session 2024-2025, the level of clothing grant is £120 per eligible pupil. This year there is an extra winter payment of £50 for each child receiving school clothing grant to help buy winter clothing. A maximum of one grant will be paid for each child during any school year.
