School Day

Arrival on First Day

Children will stay in school from 9:15am until 2:15pm for the first day thereafter it will be 9am-3pm. On the first morning parents should bring their child into the school building through the classroom door in the playground. Parents and family can accompany their child into the classroom and take photographs if they wish to do so.

After the first day children should line up at their classroom door in the playground where they will be collected by the Class Teacher. Parents, when visiting the school must always enter through the front entrance in line with school security procedures. All children must be collected by an adult promptly at 3pm in the infant playground.

School Lunches/Clothing Grants

Children can bring a packed lunch or receive a school lunch. All children in Primary 1 are eligible for a free school meal. However, we would still encourage all parents to apply for this and/or a clothing grant (if you are eligible) as this helps the school to receive grants and funding, as well as Parents receiving additional payments during holiday periods. Parent Pay

ParentPay is a secure online payment system that has replaced cash payments in all Renfrewshire Schools. With ParentPay, parents and carers will be able to pay for their child's school meals, trips, events, and activities online using a debit or credit card. Your child will require a picture to allow them to choose their lunch and all parents and carers will be required to set up an account for their child in August. More information will be provided on the induction meeting on 10th June.

Scottish Child Payment

Scottish Child Payment is a new benefit introduced by the Scottish Government to tackle child poverty. It is for low-income families already in receipt of qualifying benefits. To start with, Scottish Child Payment will be available to families with children under six years of age only. Low-income families with a child under six will be able to apply for £26.70 per child, per week - equivalent to £1,388.40 per year. There is also the Best Start School Age payment which is currently set at £314.45per child. There are no limits on the number of eligible children supported by Scottish Child Payment. Absences

Please inform the school before 9.15am if your child is absent. If possible, all appointments for the dentist and doctor should be arranged out with school hours. Please make every effort to avoid family holidays during term time. See below our attendance key facts:

Why is attendance at school and punctuality important? Because every second counts.

90% attendance may sound good. However, this is the equivalent of missing a half day of schooling EACH WEEK.

If this continues over every five years a child spends at school, a child with 90% attendance will miss HALF A YEAR'S schooling.

A child with 80% attendance will lose A FULL YEAR of schooling over the same period.

Did You Know?

A 2 week holiday during the school term means that the highest attendance your child can achieve is 94.7%

Did You Know?

If you are 15 minutes late each day you will have missed 2 full weeks of School in one year!!

Wet Days

On wet mornings the children should be brought in through their classroom door which will be open from 8.50 am.

Uniform

In St. Fergus' all pupils wear an agreed uniform, which is:

As all uniforms are identical it is very difficult to track down individual items of clothing which have been lost unless they are clearly marked with the child's name. PLEASE NOTE THAT TARTAN AND BLACK ARE NOT OUR SCHOOL COLOURS. PLEASE PUT NAMES ON ALL ARTICLES OF CLOTHING.

P.E. Days and Jewellery

You will be informed by the Class Teacher when your child is to have P.E. The children can leave shorts and sandshoes in the class. The children find it easier if they wear a polo shirt on P.E. days. For health and safety reasons we request that jewellery i.e., earrings, rings, bangles, necklaces are removed. Unfortunately, the school cannot replace valuable items of jewellery which are lost or stolen, therefore, to avoid distress children should not bring items of value to school.







Health Promoting School

As a health promoting school, we encourage children to bring a PLASTIC WATER bottle to school. Juice can be consumed during break and lunch; however, fizzy and energy drinks should not be brought into school.

Nut, Free Zone

We are a <u>Nut</u> free school due to children having severe allergies that are life threatening. Please always check the ingredients of your child's snacks prior to them bringing them into school.

Playground Supervision

There is always an adult presence in the school playground in St. Fergus. There are Classroom Assistants and an Inclusion Support Assistant on duty daily supported by the Janitor and Depute Head Teacher/Head Teacher when available. P7 children provide a buddying service to support P1 pupils in the first few weeks of their schooling.
