#### **Safe Kids Event**



The children will be attending this event at The St Mirren Stadium on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> May. Safekids organised by Renfrewshire Council's Community Learning and Development team is a multi-agency experiential learning programme which aims to reduce the number of accidents in young people and also to promote positive behaviour and eliminate risks. The Safekids Programme has been running in Renfrewshire for over 10 years and has proven to be very successful. Safekids is founded on the experiential learning ethos: "Tell me, and I may forget. Show me, and I may

remember. Involve me, and I will understand". Every Primary 6 pupil within Renfrewshire will have the

opportunity to learn vital life skills through participation in a variety of safety workshops delivered by Community Safety Partners.

#### **School Trips - Term 3**

It is going to be a very busy last term with some school trips, Primary 7 will be teaming up with Glencoats primary for an open top bus tour related to the novel Divided City, they will be taking in the sights of Glasgow as well as a tour of Hampden Park on the 14<sup>th</sup> May. They will also have 2 Activity Days which will be run by our partners, OneRen. The children will have the opportunity to take part in several outdoor activities which will help them in their team building before they leave us for Secondary School, these will include Climbing, Archery, Fencing, Kayaking, Paddleboarding and Fire Lighting. Day one will be on **Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> June** at the KGV in Renfrew and Day 2 will be on **Thursday 19th June** at Loch Lomond. On the **24<sup>th</sup> June** Primaries 1-6 are going on 2 separate trips, last year our younger classes found Heads of Ayr a long day.

Primary 1- 3 are having a full day at Rouken Glen Park where they will be pond dipping, going on a forest walk to the water fall and having fun and games in the park.

Primaries 4- 6 are heading to Blair Drummond Safari Park and will return to school around 4:30pm. Parents will be asked to make contributions to all trips and this will be confirmed in separate letters which will be issued after the Easter Holidays.

For St Andrew's Academy, Mr Henry, has informed the schools that the cost of lunch on these days will be £2.50.

#### **School Attendance- Key Facts**

Why is attendance at school and punctuality important? Because every second counts.

**90%** attendance may sound good. However, this is the equivalent of missing a **half day of schooling EACH WEEK.** 

If this continues **over every five years** a child spends at school, a child with **90%** attendance will miss **HALF A YEAR'S** schooling.

A child with 80% attendance will lose A FULL YEAR of schooling over the same period.

A 2 week holiday during the school term means that the highest attendance your child can achieve is 94.7%

If you are 15 minutes late each day you will have missed 2 full weeks of School in one year!!

#### **Are You Getting What You Are Entitled To?**

The Scottish Government provides free school meals to all children in Primary 1-5. Our new school lunch menus are available to view on Renfrewshire Council's Website by following this link: https://www.renfrewshire.gov.uk/article/2880/Primary-school-lunch-menus

#### **Free School Meals**

Your child may be entitled to free school meals if:

- Your child attends a Renfrewshire school or has been placed in an educational establishment outside Renfrewshire-by-Renfrewshire Council, or;
- You receive income support, any income-related element of employment and support allowance, maximum working tax credits (if you earn less than £6,420/year), child tax credit only (if you earn less than £16,190) or pension credit

Should your application be accepted Free School Meal payments are made during school holidays. Who will get the payments:

If your child is in P6 or P7 and they get free school meals on the basis of low income (family on certain benefits), you'll get the payment automatically.

If your child gets a school meal because they are in primary 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5, you'll only get the payment if:

- they're entitled to a free school meal on the basis of low income (family on certain benefits)
- you've applied for free school meals for this school year (August 2024 to June 2025).

#### **Clothing Grants**

Parents or carers of children attending Renfrewshire primary, secondary or additional support needs schools during the school session who satisfy the financial conditions are eligible to apply for free school meals and/or clothing grants. A clothing grant is a payment made by Renfrewshire Council to qualifying parents or carers to assist with the purchase of school uniforms. For session 2024-2025, the level of clothing grant is £120 per eligible pupil. A maximum of one grant will be paid for each child during any school year.
