




...get better at talking about and reflecting on our skills and achievements

Primary 5 - 7 will profile skills and achievements using an online platform.


How will we know if we improve?

Our jotter work will clearly show what we are learning, and our wall displays will show off our good work.


We will be more confident when doing new things.
