A copy of this session's 'School Improvement Plan' can also be found in the same section of our website as highlighted above.



School Value School Improvement Rationale Faith Developing as a Community of Faith and the Implementation of Laudato si: Following an extended period of Lockdown and the impact of the global pandemic, we recognise the importance of reconnecting with one another, our Parish and Cluster as a community of faith. We want our children to learn in an environment where they are ecologically aware through prayer, learning and action. We will make effective use of self- evaluation to ensure that a rights-based approach is adopted in our school to begin the formal embedding of children's rights into all aspects of school life and beyond. Developing Reading:

We recognise the importance of Reading as being crucial to children's development and potential for success in life. Through professional dialogue we have identified that there is an appetite amongst staff to review and improve our pedagogical practice around reading and foster a productive reading culture within our school.

We want to ensure that our children are challenged appropriately within their reading to enable them to fulfil and exceed their potential.

We will facilitate this strategic change through the implementation of the 'Hooked on Books' evidencebased approach.

Success



Moderation of Learning and Teaching:

Due to impact of COVID 19 and subsequent lockdowns, we recognise there is potential for significant negative impact on attainment levels in literacy, particularly in writing, of our pupils. We recognise that we need to provide strong curricular focus for our pupils to reestablish work routines and close the attainment gap. We also recognise the need to moderate and share standards in our school community to keep aspirations and expectations high for all learners.


Ensuring Equality, Inclusion and Health and Wellbeing (HIGIOS4 3.1):

Please ask your child to share the expectations outlined in their Class Charter with you.







Health and Wellbeing: Anti Bullying:

During the month of November, the children will take part in a three week block of Anti Bullying lessons. These learning experiences will also refer to Cyberbullying. The theme of this year's Anti Bullying week which begins on the 15th November 2021 is: 'One Kind Word' and as kindness underpins all of our school values, this is an area that we will be working on together to promote through various whole school activities.

The children will take part in an Anti Bullying poster competition to remind us of the key messages associated with bullying behaviour.

The children will also have the opportunity to work as part of a team and earn 'House Points' by demonstrating the behaviours that they want to see in the playground. They will work hard to 'catch' others demonstrating the behaviours that they have identified as desirable within their Playground Charters.

In St. Fillan's, we focus on preventative measures to discourage bullying behaviour through having an inclusive ethos and a focus on celebrating diversity.

The 'Keep Safe' kids app is available to download onto mobile devices from the app store and provides useful links to charities and organisations that can help support children and families with important issues around health and wellbeing.




<u>Promoting Alternative Thinking Strategies (PATHS):</u>


This year, we embark upon our fifth year participating in the PATHS programme, we are delighted to share data of the impact that the programme has made on improving outcomes for our learners.

The data is based on the impact of the programme from the last academic session and it show's the percentage of added value in each of the three key areas that PATHS aims to develop: reduced aggression/disruptive behaviour, improved concentration/attention and improved social/emotional competence.

We are encouraged by our results and hope to build upon the success of the programme this academic session.







Treehouse:

This term, our children will engage in a new series of online modules which are designed to develop a whole host of key skills in relation to health and wellbeing.

Each module encourages a 'Dinner Table' conversation and this is an opportunity for families to discuss the key learning and concepts being explored in each module. Learning and Teaching:

Being part of a small school has many benefits including the wider range of opportunities that our children receive. Here is a snapshot of some of the activities that classes will participate in over the next term:

COP26:

The raising of awareness around environmental issues is central to our work within the 'Laudato Si' religious programme and every class across the school will engage in a series of learning and teaching learning experiences around the importance of doing what we can to preserve our planet for the benefit of future generations.

Scottish Traditional Music:

Primary 5 will take part in an eight week block of 'Traditional Scottish Music' lessons with the instructor Sean. They will learn about traditional Scottish musical instruments and have a go at performing and singing in Gaelic.

NYCOS (National Youth Choir of Scotland) Singing Games & Rhymes.

The boys and girls in Primaries 2/1, 3 and 4/3 will take part in a six week block of 'Singing Games and Rhymes.' They will participate in singing traditional Scottish songs and rhymes which will be facilitated by Kirsty and Janet. The instructors aim to bring songs alive through creative and fun ways!

Strathgryffe Tennis Club Taster Sessions:

The children in Primary 3 and Primary 4/3 are being invited to take part in taster Tennis sessions in partnership with Strathgryffe Tennis Club on Monday 1^{st} November (Primary 3) and Monday 8^{th} November (Primary 4/3).

St. Benedict's Young Sports Leaders Programme:
