## St. Bernadette Relics



The Diocese have yet to issue finalised guidance and we will circulate further information in due course.






## School Improvement Planning

## **Complaints Procedures**

As we are a small school, we are in the fortunate position of having very close working relationships with our families. We know our children very welland as such all our staff are able and skilled in supporting our children as they grow and develop.

We do, however recognise that at times, there may be issues that present and we would welcome joint partnership working with our families using a solutions focussed approach.

In our school, we view dissatisfaction or complaints as an opportunity to build relationships and work together to improve our service.

In the first instance, we would kindly ask that we are given an opportunity to find a frontline resolution and inline with Renfrewshire Councils policy and practice, we would aim to do this within five working days. This provides us with time to investigate situations fully, discuss with staff/children/families, seek a resolution, create a plan of action and communicate this to all parties along with a date for actions to be reviewed. Having this time and space enables us to maintain existing diary commitments, meetings, training and our work with the children.

After this period, if you continue to be dissatisfied, then a referral to 'Stage 2' of the process would be communicated to you and next steps outlined in an email. The timescale for this stage would be around twenty working days or sooner, depending upon the nature of the complaint.

When phonecalls are received, we endeavour to return the call as soon as we possible. However, we have a small leadership team who can at times be diary/class committed and you may be asked to put your enquiry into writing or provide us with a suitable day to contact you. When phonecalls are received, our Office Staff will ask you what your call is in relation to. You will then be directed to the most relevant member of the team to discuss your enquiry, whether that be the class teacher or member of the SLT (Senior Leadership Team).

Requests to meet with Class Teachers and the SLT should be made in advance and our Office Staff will communicate arrangements with you via telephone call, email or in writing.

## School Vision, Values and Aims

Our school vision, values and aims are the beating heart of our school and the core beliefs of what we are aiming to achieve.

As a Catholic School, we also follow the 'Charter for Catholic Schools' and our core values echo the values contained in the Gospels.

The core values are displayed around the school and we spend time at Assembly discussing them and considering how we can 'Be the best we can be' through living out our beliefs in our thoughts, words and actions. They permeate throughout everything that we do both socially and academically to develop the 'whole child.'

As always, we will spend time this school session discussing the 'St. Fillan Standard' and what this looks like, sounds like and feels like and we hope to share our ongoing thoughts with you.

The St. Fillan's Standard of conduct and behaviour is based on the three themes of 'Ready, Respectful and Safe.' It is through these dispositions that we encourage our children to make the right choices in their thoughts, words and actions.

Values based education, the UNCRC (Rights of the Child) and Gospel values and teachings are discussed and explored during our comprehensive Assembly Programme as is the health and wellbeing curriculum, wider achievement and the celebration of success. The children are active participants in their learning and have been working together in vertical learning House groups to share their learning in floor books. Wed hope to share their work with you as the session progresses.


The golden rule of the PATHS (Promoting Alternative Thinking Strategies) Health and Wellbeing Programme is to 'treat other People the way that you would wish to be treated,' and the children are regularly reminded of what this means and looks like in practice. During August, we revisited the school value of Respect and the Gospel value of Justice. Learning was linked to aspects of social justice in terms of our needs being met on an individual basis and how this may look differently for everyone when considering varying contexts. Our children und erstand that everyone may not be treated the same, but they will be treated fairly and in accordance with their needs at a particular point in time. Our children are being encouraged to show kindness and empathy to their peers and friends who are facing adversity or challenges and they have considered ways in which they can actively put our school values into action. Some of the children's thoughts and suggestions to promote these core values are as follows:

- Respect that children are all different. We all have different personalities and that is okay.
- Respect that children act/behave differently and try to support each other with challenges.
- Respect other people's point of view. Everyone's point of view is important but it might not be the same and that is okay.
- Respect each other by what we say and how we behave. We do not need to be best friends with everyone, but we do need to treat one another with respect.
- Respect is like having good manners, it is free!
- Respect should eventually be a way of being.
- Everyone will not be treated the same as everyone is different. We will be treated fairly and given support.

In September, we will explore the school value of Responsibility and the Gospel value of Integrity/Honesty. Children will learn that while choosing honesty is not always an easy path to follow, it is always the right path to choose and can prevent situations from escalating.

The school aim that we have focussed on in August is 'Being Brave' and in September, we will consider how we can 'Unleash Creativity.'

Our core values and aims are always explored using the principle of 'Kindness' as a focus. The video clip below is one that is shared with the children as a reminder that small acts of kindness have enormous potential to spread.

## Catholic Schools in Scotland



The mission of the Catholic school is to develop as a community of faith and learning, providing the highest quality of education, and offering formation through the promotion of Gospel values, through celebration and worship, and through service to the common good.

## Playground Charter





The principles within the St. Fillan's Standard of being 'Ready, Respectful, Safe' was used last session to create our Playground Charter. The Charter was created by the children and the standards were shared and agreed in March 2022.

These form the behaviours that everyone should try to follow to enable everyone to benefit from having a successful playtime.

The children understand that everyone has the right to enjoying a successful playtime and they know that 'Team work' is required to make this goal a reality.

Mrs McPherson will revisit the Charter during Assembly and the children will be encouraged to make changes should they wish to do so.

Our focus this term will be: 'Bee Ready!'



#### Absences

Please inform the school by letter, text or telephone if your child is absent, preferably before 9.00am and provide a note on his or her return to school. We record the reason for children's absence on our electronic system and correspondence from parents are kept in each child's confidential file.

Every effort should be made to avoid family holidays during term time, as this both disrupts your child's education and reduces learning time. We understand that due to work commitments, it can sometimes be problematic to arrange holidays, however, family holidays taken during term time will be recorded as unauthorised and you will receive a standard letter to notify you as per Local Authority guidance. Please also be mindful that the end of a school term is particularly busy with a range of events such as: Sports Day, Bump Up Day, Election of House/Vice Captains and other leadership roles and Assessments. The timings of these events have been set in advance and it is not possible to schedule these sooner in the school calendar for a variety of reasons.

Pupil absence is monitored on a monthly basis. Letters are sent out to parents to highlight attendance levels which are causing concern and parents/carers may be invited to discuss this matter with the Head Teacher.

We understand that many families continue to have anxieties around the Covid pandemic and we are more than happy to support your child's attendance. Please contact the school to arrange a telephone consultation or appointment.

In June 2019, the Scottish government refreshed their 'Included, Engaged and Involved' policy which informs the decisions we make as a school around the management of attendance. This includes decisions around periods of authorised absence.

## **Rewarding Resilience**





We are delighted to share the news that St. Mirren Football Club has don ated four season tickets to every school in Renfrewshire and this would enable a family to attend a home game free of charge.

As a staff, we have agreed that a fair way of distribution would be for the class teacher in each class to work with the children and nominate a child who has shown resilience in some aspect of their life or learning. The children's names would then be added to the draw and a child/family would be selected at random to receive the reward. A certificate would be awarded to the child at Assembly and a letter would then be sent home to communicate arrangements. If tickets were unable to be used, then the ballot would be redrawn and another family would benefit from the reward.

We will discuss the criteria around the nomination for the ballot at Assembly and the children's ideas will be utilised as a means to nominate an individual across the school.

We are excited about this reward and look forward to hearing great stories of children 'bouncing back' and empowering themselves

## Active Schools Clubs

We have liaised with our Active Schools Co-ordinator, Lynsey Dawson to provide a range of exciting and fun Active Schools Clubs this term. A letter outlining dates and costs of clubs will be circulated via ParentPay when coaches have confirmed their availability. The programme is as follows:

- Primaries 2 and 3 Having a Ball an opportunity to explore PE equipment and it's use through fun games and team activities.
- Primaries 4 and 5 Team Sports a club designed to promote positive relationships and team building skills.
- Primaries 6 and 7 Competition Club this club will prepare children to participate in a range of forthcoming tournaments such as: Football, Basketball and Netball. Skills will be developed.

There is no designated club for our Primary one children this term as our focus would be on the settling period following transition from Nursery.

Our children benefit from being part of a small school and as such, they receive a range of opportunities to participate in events that would not be possible in a bigger establishment. When children are selected to take part in an event/tournament, a letter outlining the reasons for selection will be issued. ## Wellbeing Survey
