Reading for Fun

Across the school this term, there has been a big focus on reading. We have been taking part in ERIC time in class. ERIC stands for Everyone Reading In Class and we complete this at least 3 times per week. We have been wearing badges that tell people who walk past to ask us what we are reading so that we are engaging in conversations about books. We even completed a sponsored Readathon to raise money for SCIAF. Topic

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Our topic this term was Dinosaurs. The main curricular areas that were explored were Literacy, Numeracy, Social Studies, Science and Technologies and Expressive Arts. We used marble paints to create our very own dinosaur eggs before adding in a lollipop dinosaur puppet. We are very proud of them. In Science, we learned how to label the parts of a dinosaur from it's teeth to it's toes. We also learned about food chains through our topic and whether different dinosaurs were carnivores (meat eaters), herbivores (grass and plan eaters) or omnivores (a mix of both). Over the course of two weeks, we created fantastic fact files about our chosen dinosaur. We used the internet and books to research and find facts to present to our friends in class. Miss Duffy was so impressed with the standard of the fact files we all made!

Expressive Arts

We have had lots of fin in expressive arts this term. For Bonfire Night, we created our own firework biscuits using icing sugar, food colouring and sprinkles. After creating out tasty treats, we enjoyed eating them whilst watching a Greatest Showman inspired firework display. This was such fun day. Every Thursday morning, we have been very lucky to have Mrs Lax from NYCOS teaching us singing games and rhymes. So far, we have learned about the beat of a song and how to count it out using our hands and wooden sticks.

Through the month of December, we have been learning about Advent and the story of the Nativity. We know that in the Church we see purple during the month of December because it is a time of preparation. We have been focusing on showing kindness to others during Advent and living the way Jesus wants us to.


"I researched the T-Rex and it was great fun. I also loved making the dinosaur eggs."
