











#### **OUR SCHOOL MOTTOS**

#### **OUR SCHOOL MOTTOS**




**S**chool **J**ourney **B**egins – this was chosen with particular reference to our primary one children who are at the beginning of this new chapter in their learning journey

**S**triving *for* **J**oy *and* **B**rilliance – this is our aspiration for our entire school community


**S**afety **J**ustice *and excellent* **B**ehaviour – this reflects our core values for our children




# CLASS COMPOSITION – PRIMARY 1 & PRIMARY 1/2

- Next session we will have a primary 1 and a primary 1/2 class. This has also been the case this session.
- How will this work for my child? All primary 1 children will receive their specific learning inputs in literacy & numeracy together. This input may be delivered by any of the 3 teachers within the primary 1 team.
- In the afternoon and for other curricular areas the children will work within their class groupings with their allocated class teacher.

# CLASS COMPOSITION – PRIMARY 1 & PRIMARY 1/2

- Feedback from parents of children who have been in composite classes this year:
- "Overall we have had a positive experience with our child in a composite class."
- "From a positive educational point I think my daughter seeing primary 2 work has gave her more drive to excel."


#### **OUR SCHOOL UNIFORM**

# FIRST DAY AT SCHOOL WEDNESDAY 16<sup>TH</sup> AUGUST 2023




On this date we will welcome you and your child at 9.15am. Children and adults should enter the playground via the school gates next to the car park. You will be met by members of the senior leadership team and you will have the opportunity to take photographs of your child in the playground before they go into their classroom.

At 9.30am children will be directed to line up at their classroom door. Class teachers will take the children into the class to begin their first day at school.

Unless they are travelling home by school transport children should be collected from their classroom at the end of the school day.

Class teachers will dismiss children from the classroom at the end of the school day.

#### THE END OF THE SCHOOL DAY




Your child's class teacher will not dismiss your child unless they know who is collecting them. Please ensure that you inform the class teacher if there is any change to collection arrangements.

If there is a change to your collection arrangements during the school day please contact the school office.

If we are unsure over any collection arrangements we will phone you to confirm these.

For children travelling by school transport please ensure that you inform the school of which days your child will be travelling by school transport.

#### LEARNING IN PRIMARY ONE



We follow the primary one pedagogy, this is a method of teaching which is based around play.

Children will have a mix of play based learning activities, both inside and outside.

Children will also engage in focussed, adult led learning activities.

The day will begin with an active start where children have free choice learning activities. During this time children will also choose their lunch and check in with their class teacher.

At 9.25am the children will come together with their class teacher to say their morning prayer. Following this structured learning activities will begin.

#### LITERACY IN PRIMARY ONE



Children will follow the Jolly Phonics programme to learn the individual phonic sounds.

Children will learn 2 new sounds each week.

Children will practice saying, recognising and writing these single sounds, as the progress children will then use these to blend CVC words.

From this children will begin to blend and read CVC words e.g. sat

We use the Big Cat reading scheme. Early reading books do not have words, instead parents are encouraged to look at these books with their children and talk about the pictures.

Children are encouraged to develop their fine motor skills in a variety of ways from writing, to mark making in sand, forming letters with play doh.

### NUMERACY IN PRIMARY ONE



Children will learn Stages of Early Arithmetical Learning (SEAL).

Children will learn to work within numbers o-20


Children will initially learn place value, the order of numbers and the value of each individual number.

Children will then move onto learning 'number stories', this is the beginning of learning to add & subtract numbers.

Children will also learn about shape, position and movement, data handling and information handling.

We use Heinemann numeracy learning resources.

#### HOMEWORK IN PRIMARY ONE



Homework will be set weekly.

This allows for flexibility across the week. We recommend that children complete some homework tasks each night rather than completing all homework tasks in one session.

Homework will be shared via your child's homework diary and on the primary one google classroom. Some resources will be shared electronically so it is important that you remember to log into google classroom regularly.

Your child should bring homework into school in their homework bag. Homework bags can be purchased from Schoolwear Made Easy.

#### **OUR SCHOOL UNIFORM**



We are very proud of our school uniform in St John Bosco Primary School. Children should wear traditional school uniform every day. On PE days children get changed into PE kit.

#### Our school uniform

**Boys:** Blue blazer/blue fleece jacket with school badge, grey trousers, blue shirt, school tie, grey pullover

**Boys PE:** Blue shorts, St John Bosco branded PE top, no jewellery. PE kits should be left in school. Children will change for PE lessons.

#### **OUR SCHOOL UNIFORM**



We are very proud of our school uniform in St John Bosco Primary School. Children should wear traditional school uniform every day. On PE days children get changed into PE kit.

**Girls**: Blue blazer/blue fleece jacket with school badge, grey skirt / grey trousers, blue shirt, school tie, grey pullover/cardigan

**Girls PE:** Blue shorts, St John Bosco branded PE top, no jewellery. PE kits should be left in school. Children will change for PE lessons.

#### **BREAKTIME**



Breaktime for primary one children is from 10.30am – 10.45am.


You should provide your child with a healthy snack and a drink of water for break time.

We are a nut free school. Please ensure that your child does not bring any nut products or products containing nuts into school.

Children will be supervised by adults in the playground at breaktime.

If your child has a trip or fall a minor incident slip will be completed and sent home. If your child has a bump to the head the school office will phone you.

#### LUNCHTIME



All children in primaries 1 - 5 are entitled to free school meals.

Children can choose to have a school lunch or to bring a packed lunch from home.


The school lunch menu will be sent home to parents at the beginning of the school session. If your child has any allergies or food intolerances please inform the school.

Children choose their lunch option on the Promethean board in class each morning.

Children eat lunch in the lunch hall. Staff are in the lunch hall each day to support the children and ensure that they eat their lunch.

After children have eaten their lunch they will go out to play.


#### **SCHOOL TRANSPORT**

#### **SCHOOL TRANSPORT**



In the morning children are met from the school bus by a member of staff. Children are escorted into the school playground.

If there is a change to your collection arrangements during the school day please contact the school office. If we are unsure over any collection arrangements we will phone you to confirm these before your child is put onto the school bus.


We have a register of school bus children which is completed before children are escorted onto the bus.

Children are put onto the school bus by a member of school staff who will check that they have their seatbelt on and they are settled on the bus.





Weekly Diary – our weekly diary is uploaded onto our school app to provide you with an overview of events across the school each week.


Newsletter – our fortnightly newsletter is uploaded to our school app & website every second Friday. Our newsletter keeps you up to date with events in our school and parish communities.

Chieri - red


Turin - blue

Children receive house points for a variety of reasons and can also earn further house points during whole school events such as Sports Day


#### **BUDDY SYSTEM**

## INDUCTION DAY 2 AND DAY 3


#### Induction Session 2 Arrangements – Wednesday 31st May - 1:30


