At a recent Parent Partnership meeting I shared that we are currently reviewing our Relationships Policy. All classes have been focussing on Health and Wellbeing and as part of this they have been sharing their thoughts and ideas regarding our school rules, our values, our vision and our reward systems. Proposal

This year we would like to change the way we celebrate success. In the past our school celebrated success in various ways including Pupil of the Week, Ace Achievers and Monthly Certificates including The Well Done and Star Pupil Award. Through feedback we recognise that children do not always receive a certificate frequently enough and we would like to be more responsive in celebrating success.

As a school we propose the following:

1. All classes will display Recognition Boards - staff will set a target and as children achieve the target their name is added to the board. The target can be changed as and when works best for the class.
2. Hot Chocolate Friday – children and staff who consistently demonstrate our school values of Kindness, Honesty and Respect are invited to have a hot chocolate and a biscuit with the HT. Photographs will be shared of children enjoying a hot chocolate via Twitter #SJOHOTChocFri and will take home a sticker.



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3. The Positive Note - this is high level recognition. Celebrating children who go above and beyond! A special note will be sent home from the school to the parent/carer. Children who receive the note will be celebrated through the school newsletter and get a free pass to Hot Chocolate Friday. These notes can be sent home weekly.

We would also like to keep the Ace Achiever Certificates. If your child has been recognised for an achievement outside of school and received a certificate, award or a medal then we would ask that they bring the award, or a photo, or a note from home into school and we will add them to our Ace Achiever Book. Children's achievements will be celebrated through the monthly newsletter.

COVID Update

Currently in schools we are still following physical distancing and wearing face coverings, especially at the start and end of each day where our school gate becomes crowded. Could I please ask all parents/carers, when dropping off and picking up, to leave the area as soon as possible and not congregate in groups. Thank you in advance for your understanding. A reminder of the staggered start and end times:

Class	Start Time	End of Day
P1a, P1b, P2, P2/3 and P3	8:50am	2:50pm
P4, P5, P6 and P7	9am	3pm

In line with the wider changes to self-isolation guidance, in the event of a positive test, schools are no longer involved in contact tracing. This is now conducted by the Test and Protect team. You should continue to inform the school of any positive test results or if a pupil has been identified through Test and Protect and asked to isolate and go for a PCR test. Those with a positive test should continue to follow the guidance and isolate for 10 days. Those children who receive a negative PCR result can return to school, even if a household member tests positive, as long as they do not display any symptoms and are clear of a temperature by 48hrs. We understand that these are challenging times for everyone but by working together we can continue to keep our school community safe.
