As parents and guardians, we must lead by example for our

children in the home and in support of our schools and parish. Something which has been working well in one of our primary schools is the formation of a Laudato Si' Parent Group, which has had successes with a uniform recycling scheme, school ground clear up days and other faith events. Children have a huge appetite for activism, especially when it's a family event, so let's use this month to encourage them to 'care for our common home' (Pope Francis, 2015).

<u>October – The Rosary</u>

October, in the liturgical year, is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The Holy Rosary is a simple, yet deep and meaningful prayer which can lead us, as children, adults and families, to the heart of our faith. For families just beginning to pray together or wanting to try, it provides easy structure. Praying in front of others is to be vulnerable, so, having a clear focus through



the Rosary can really help everyone feel more comfortable. For others it can add a new dimension to prayer life together as there are many ways to pray the rosary, a decade a day, one of the mysteries per week, whatever is manageable with the ages and stages of our children! We can also support our schools and parishes by attending family Rosary events, or perhaps working with others to set one up. The Children's Rosary movement have good information on how to set up a lay group for children's prayer,

The charity Missio also have a lovely resource describing how to pray The Mission Rosary, with a focus on praying for the whole world, especially for those who are poor and vulnerable which could also be tied in with World Mission Sunday, which this year is on 20th October, <u>How-to-pray-the-Rosary.pdf</u>. Please take a look at the further resources below for ideas for the rosary at home and when wondering if what we do is enough, remember Pope Francis' words when discussing the Rosary in October 2020;

"In some evenings we can feel useless and lonely. It is then that prayer will come and knock on the door of our hearts," he said. "And even if we have done something wrong, or if we feel threatened and frightened, when we return before God with prayer, serenity and peace will return as if by miracle."

This is no less true today, let us invite our children to run to the Lord when faced with worry and fear. He is the certainty in an uncertain world.
