All things Literacy! (School Improvement Priority 2)

Talk for Writing

As part of our improvements in literacy this session, we are in the process of introducing a new approach to the delivery of writing called 'Talk for Writing' across the school.

Talk for Writing has had an outstanding impact on schools. Typically, schools have found that children initially double their rate of progress and, where the approach has been applied systematically across a setting, many schools have moved from dire results to outstanding success. Schools already performing well have not only increased attainment, but also enjoyment and engagement.

All teaching staff will complete the next part of training on our next In-Service day which takes place on Monday 24th October. Following this, we will begin delivery of the programme with a focus on non-fiction writing i.e., instructions, reports etc. across the school between October and the Christmas holidays. Read, Write Count Bags

Maths Week Scotland – WINNERS!

We recently celebrated Maths Week Scotland, during which the children took part in lots of fun maths activities. In addition to this, we invited the children to dress up and we were so impressed by the fantastic effort that was made across the school. We were delighted to have our efforts recognised by Renfrewshire Numeracy Team by winning the 'dress up' category! We have been awarded £50 which will be put to good use in purchasing some new maths resources for the school. We would like to

say a special thank you to everyone who took part and for all your support at home. A big thank you also to our Numeracy Champion, Miss McPherson for all her hard work in organising such a fantastic Maths week!







National Numeracy Parental Engagement Project We are delighted to have been selected from a high number of schools from across Scotland to participate in the National Numeracy Parental Engagement Project. The project aims to support schools in developing their parental engagement strategies, in order to improve the confidence of both children and parents/carers in maths. This session, we have chosen to focus on P5-7, with a view to it being rolled out further across the school next session. Mrs Mitchell and Miss McPherson are the Project Leads, and they will be hosting a 'Maths & Munchies' event for P5-7 on Wednesday 12th October at 3 - 3.45pm. All P5-7 parents/carers will now have received a separate invite to this event, and we look forward to welcoming as many of you as possible!

Modelling and Coaching Officer

As part of our work to raise attainment in numeracy, we will be working with a Modelling and Coaching Officer for numeracy. We are delighted to welcome Mr Gallagher who will be working in a number of classes across the school this session. **Other News!**

Howdens Engineering Project

Primary 6 have been invited to take part in the National Leader's Award competition by the local business Howden's. The competition will ask pupils "If you were an engineer, what

would you do?" They will then identify a problem in the world around them and come up with a creative solution for them. The pupils' designs are then graded by engineers with every pupil receiving a named certificate, as well as an invitation to a public exhibition where the shortlisted ideas from across the country are displayed. The

project will begin with the pupils taking part in a site visit to Howden's on Thursday 27th October. Good luck primary 6!

Paisley Art Show

We were delighted to welcome local artist Lil Brookes to work with some of our infant classes earlier this term. During this visit, the children enjoyed seeing some of Lil's fantastic work, including her famous Paisley Pattern teardrop design which was used to the Paisley City of Culture Campaign. One way system and Safe Parking

Please remember that the school asks those dropping off/collecting pupils at the start/end of

the school day to follow a voluntary one-way system. Cars should enter Maxwellton Road from Maxwellton Street and leave in the direction of Newton Street. Please pass this reminder on to all relevant family members/friends. Those dropping off/collecting pupils are also asked to consider parking further along Maxwellton Road **(avoiding the zig-zags and yellow lines)** or on Newton Street to ease congestion immediately outside the school entrance.

Nut Allergies

We would like to remind all parents/carers that we have children in our school with nut allergies. For that reason, we request that parents and carers observe a **nut-free policy** and therefore do not include nuts, or any traces of nuts, in packed lunches. All children are regularly reminded about the good hygiene practice of washing hands before and after eating which helps to reduce the risk of secondary contamination.

Are You Getting What You Are Entitled To?

Free School Meals

Your child may be entitled to free school meals if:

- Your child attends a Renfrewshire school or has been placed in an educational establishment outside Renfrewshire by Renfrewshire Council, or;
- You receive income support, any income-related element of employment and support allowance, maximum working tax credits (if you earn less than £6,420/year), child tax credit only (if you earn less than £16,190) or pension credit

Clothing Grants

Parents or carers of children attending Renfrewshire primary, secondary or additional support needs schools during the school session who satisfy the financial conditions are eligible to apply for free school meals and/or clothing grants. A clothing grant is a payment made by Renfrewshire Council to qualifying parents or carers to assist with the purchase of school uniforms. For session 2020-2021, the level of clothing grant is £100 per eligible pupil. A maximum of one grant will be paid for each child during any school year.
