Reporting Absence and Latecoming

You will all have received the general letter on school absence. I hope this has helped you to appreciate the importance of children coming to school. Please remember to call the school **before 9.30am** if your child is going to absent. If we do not have a reason for the absence and we cannot get in touch with you, because of out of date contact details, we have to report your child as missing and refer to the authorities. Please ensure any changes of contact details are given to the school ASAP. Please ensure children arrive prior to the school bell to ensure a positive start to the day. I will be issuing attendance letters over the next few weeks to those who have dropped below 95%. If you require any support with attendance, please contact me.

Holidays during Term time

I know family holidays can be expensive but I urge you to try to avoid taking children on holiday during term time, especially at the start of the session. We are only weeks into the term and already a number of days have been lost because of holidays. Please note when children are on holiday during term time they will miss valuable learning and at the start of term they miss all the routines of their new class.

School Lunches

We have been lucky with the weather and children have continued to opt to eat their lunch outside. Now that we are lucky enough to have lots of shelter in the playground, the children will continue to be given the option to eat their packed lunch outside if they wish. As you know, the school lunch menu changed in August. Children continue to choose from 2 options each day and should get the menu choice they have requested.

Parent Pay

We will soon be introducing Parent Pay. (You may have heard of other schools already doing this as it is being implemented in a phased approach). Given the option, most parents/carers will probably prefer to pay online at a time that suits them. With Parent Pay, you do not need to queue up at the school office with cash or expect your child to carry envelopes to school with consent forms and money. All of this will be possible on line. More information to follow.

School Clothing

Please make sure all children come to school with a suitable outdoor jacket. With our new fantastic outdoor facilities, we will be taking advantage with many more outdoor learning opportunities. As we, all know the weather can be very changeable so please ensure waterproof jackets and suitable footwear every day. Lost property continues to be an increasing issue. We have around 20 jumpers in the infants alone. **Please remember to put names on all items of clothing so it can be easily identified if it goes missing.** If there is an accident and your child receives a change of clothes please wash and return them as soon as possible to allow them to be used for others. We are very short of clothing age 5-7yrs. Any donations would be appreciated. Please check lost property at Parents' Evening. Whatever is left will go to the parent council.

Wet Weather

With the design of our building having many sheltered areas we will ensure the children are outdoors for fresh air as much as possible. This may mean they are outdoors in light rain. They can shelter from the rain but benefit from the fresh air. Please remind them to make use of the shelters on wet days. In the mornings, P1 and 2 should come into the school while P3-7 should take cover under the shelters.

Flu Vaccines

You will now have received your consent form for your child to receive the Flu Vaccine via a nasal spray. These will take place on Monday 21st October. If you have not returned the consent or your child is absent, you must take them to the GP surgery to receive the vaccine.

Whole School Pantomime

Once again, we have booked a whole school pantomime. After the success of last year, we have booked the King's Theatre again this year. Details to follow, but just in case you were planning on a family panto you may want to choose a different one. This trip will mean a late return to school as the performance is at 1pm meaning we will therefore not be back at school until after 4pm. Details will follow.

The cost is approx. £17 per head. However, we are hoping with fundraising we can reduce the payment to yourselves.

Class Newsletter

We hope you found the Class Newsletter informative and provided you with relevant information about topics and what your child will be learning. Ideas of how you can support your children are also included. The next class newsletter will be issued in January.

Parents' Evening

You will now have received your slip asking for your preferred option. Actual appointment times will be issued today. It is important that all parents/carers attend these meetings, as it is an opportunity for you to discuss 1-1 with the class teacher your child's strengths and areas where you can help them. As usual, class teachers will be happy to offer resources, ideas, and any support they can. Tea/Coffee will be available with Mrs Gavin looking for some company. Lost property will also be available.

Pizza Reading

Adult Literacy Services are once again delivering pizza reading with Primary one families. This opportunity will give parents tips on how to support their child with reading. We have had a positive start, great to see so many families. Soon families from primary 2 and 3 will be able to get involved too. Look out for further information later in the year.

October - Month of Mary

During the month of October, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Rosary. Children will have the chance to say a decade of the Rosary every morning at 8.45am led by Mrs Gavin. Children should come into the studio via the main door if they would like to take part. Please bring Rosary beads with you if you have them. Parents and carers are welcome to come along too.

The Community Involvement committee are going to be hosting a bake sale on Thursday 10th October at morning break to raise money for Cash for Kids. Any donations of home baking, cakes etc. would be greatly appreciated. Otherwise, please send in a small donation for our fundraising efforts.
