

## **Breakfast Club**

Breakfast club is up and running again. It is available to pupils at 8.30am supervise (please note that doors cannot be opened to pupils before 8.30 as there will not be a member of staff there to them). Pupils can buy toast, cereal and a drink (water, milk or juice) for a small charge of 50p) They are supervised by a member of school staff until they join their line before the bell at 9am. Please collect a consent form the school office.



## **Attendance & Timekeeping**

Please contact the school office before 9.30am if your child is absent from school. If you fail to make contact with us you will receive a text at 9.30am and we ask that you respond to this as soon as possible by letting us know why your child is not at school. If we do not hear from

you at all, Mr McIntosh or another member of staff will contact you by telephone or may even visit you at home if we do not manage to speak to you, in order to ensure that every child is safe and accounted for. Please continue to cooperate with us on this matter. Please make sure your child knows who will collect him/her at the end of the school day. P1 – P3 parents should come in to the school playground. Please refrain from lifting children over the fence as this is unsafe.

# **No Dogs Allowed**

Some children are afraid of dogs and so I must inform you that you cannot bring dogs into the school playground. Please do not stand at the school entrance/exit with your dog either as this can cause lots of stress and anxiety for some. Thank you.

# **Toys**

Some pupils like to bring toys to school. While we do not discourage this, as it can be very comforting to some, we do ask that pupils do not bring valuable items. It can be very upsetting for children if valuable/sentimental items are lost or damaged. We have many playground toys that pupils are free to play with during break times. Thank you for your cooperation.



#### **Wet Weather**

Pupils will be allowed to enter the building around 8.45 when it is raining if there is adequate supervision available.

# **Hands Up Survey**

The Hands up Survey is the largest national database to look at how children travel to school across Scotland. On Monday 10 September the children will be asked how they travelled to school.

# **End of School Day**

Please ensure your child knows at the start of the day who is collecting them from school at 3pm. It can be upsetting for children when their routine changes unexpectedly. Please collect children from their exit doors in the playground. Children can only be collected from the main entrance when specific arrangements have been made with the Head Teacher.

## **Free School Meals & Clothing Grant**

Information and application forms for free school meals and clothing grants can be downloaded from the council's website <a href="www.renfrewshire.gov.uk">www.renfrewshire.gov.uk</a> or can be obtained from Customer Services in Renfrewshire House. Although children in Primary 1 – 3 have the option of a free school meal every day it is still advisable to apply for the grants if you qualify.

# **School Uniform**

School uniform for St Peter's Primary school is as follows:

- White shirt and school tie
- Grey skirt or trousers (not black)
- Grey jumper (not black)
- Black sweatshirt
- Red polo shirt
- Grev socks
- Black shoes

Hoodies are not acceptable school uniform.

## **Water Bottles**

All pupils are allowed access to water throughout the day. This helps them to stay hydrated and helps towards increasing their concentration. Please provide your child with a water bottle (clearly marked with their name) which can be filled throughout the day using our water coolers.



Please remember to park safely around the school premises. We would ask those who use vehicles to adhere to the rules of the road. Our children will benefit from your good example.

# **Appointments**

If you wish to speak to a member of staff please enter through reception and report to the school office. It is always advisable to call ahead to ensure that someone (usually Mrs Lawson or I) is available to meet with you. While we make every effort to respond immediately to your concerns there may be times when this is not possible. I would like to take the opportunity to thank everyone who visits the school for various reasons for treating staff members with respect. I would also remind you Renfrewshire Council have a zero tolerance policy against violence and aggression.

# **Staff Car Park**

Please remember that the school car park is for staff only unless there are specific arrangements in place that have been approved by Head Teacher.

As always, I am happy to discuss any concerns or matters with you at any times. Please feel free to contact me at the school. If I am unable to speak with you I will always aim to return your call within 3 working days. Normally, I will return your call on the same day.
