#### **Christmas Festival**

### Monday 20 December 2021

#### **Christmas Mass**

Wednesday 22 December 2021



Mrs Lawson has arranged with Fr Andrew to have a mass recorded in St. Peter's Church while one class attends. The recording will then be viewed by everyone at 11.10am on the last day of term. It is so important to remember the true meaning of Christmas and encourage our children to pray together as we celebrate the birth of the baby Jesus.

## **Covid Update**

We have had 26 cases of children testing positive since August 2021 and 8 staff cases. Staff are extremely vigilant when spotting signs where children could potentially be displaying symptoms. On these occasions, you will be contacted to collect your child and their siblings from school. Thank you for your speedy response and for being so cooperative when this has occurred. You are helping to keep our community safe and well.



#### **Covid - New Omicron Variant**

There has been heightened concern surrounding the new variant of Omicron. This is because there is little information known about it at present, however, I am certain that scientists will be able to provide us with more detailed data shortly. Until then, we must follow all of the advice given to us by health professionals and our Scottish Government.



### What should I do if my child has COVID symptoms?

It is extremely important that you continue to look out for symptoms of the virus amongst your own family. The most common symptoms are:

- new, continuous cough
- fever/high temperature (37.8C or greater)
- loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste

If your child has symptoms, they should not attend school and you should book them a test straightaway. They should remain at home and everyone in the household should self-isolate until they receive their test results.

More information can be found on the parentclub website by clicking <u>HERE</u>. If you do not have symptoms, you can order rapid lateral flow tests for regular testing at home.

The Scottish Government are encouraging everyone to take regular tests, particularly if you're socialising or mixing with other households.

## Self Isolation for Children and Young People

Under the current guidance, unless your child or young person is a household contact, has had a sleepover or unusually prolonged contact with a case - they will not be deemed to be a close contact.

## **Household Contacts**

If a person (staff/child) tests positive, regardless of the variant, their whole household needs to self-isolate for 10 days – regardless of their age or vaccine status or testing negative.

#### Warn and Inform Letters

Warn and inform letters will continue to be sent out to the affected class when there is a positive case.

# **Staffing**


