Stay and Play Sessions



Since returning in August 2025, we haven't had many parents/carers enquire or take part in our "stay and play" sessions. These sessions have previously been successful and beneficial.

Families are welcome to join their child at nursery to "stay and play". These sessions offer an insight into your child's play interests, friendships and their developing social skills. These sessions are also beneficial to support and build relationships between parents/carers and nursery staff as well as making secure connections between home and nursery.

Stay and play session can last for an hour, a morning, an afternoon or even a full day! Family members can choice and decide how long to play for. Please speak to a staff member to arrange.

Adventure Ted

Adventure Ted is on his way to visit you, he has started his adventures! Ted is having lots of fun sleeping over at his friends' homes. He has enjoyed going to the café, dressing up and wearing "boys brigade" uniform, watching the fireworks, going shopping, visiting relatives and playing at home! He has been well cared for, having his teeth brushed, hair brushed and clothing changed. When traveling in the car, he always wears his seatbelt.

When Adventure Ted comes to visit you, please take good care of him. We would love to hear all about his adventures with your family, so remember to complete his diary before returning him to nursery. We also ask for you to share a photograph (or two) on Facebook, which we can print out and add into his diary.

Clothing & Footwear

Can we remind families to label (name) children's clothing items (specifically St Peters ELC jumpers), this will ensure children receive the correct jumper home. Each child should leave a spare set of clothing on their pegs (including underwear & socks). Many children wear "crocs" (for indoor shoes), we have noticed during play (within specific zones) they are not ideal and we would advise lycra plimsoles or trainers - however we do not expect families to purchase these straight away, but rather when these are needing replaced to purchase plimsoles/trainers instead. Each child should be provided with a pair of wellie boots which stay at nursery, rather than going between home and nursery, this ensures children will each have a pair if they chose to go outdoors.

Changes to routine & environment (Little Learners Room - 3-5s)

We are currently making important changes within our environment and play spaces to support children's engagement and involvement within their play and learning. Over the next few weeks, you will notice play spaces being adapted as we observe and notice what is working.

Due to environment changes we have discussed the possibility of making changes to our "arrival" routine. Children will now be welcomed together within the main playroom ready for our "morning welcome time", "fun ways to listen" group and "attention bucket" group.
