Summer Reading Challenge

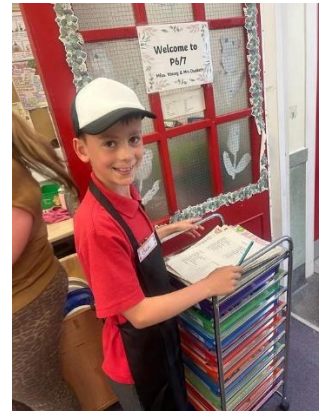

Children are encouraged to read six books or complete other fun reading goals over the summer holiday to collect stickers, rewards, and a certificate. Registration is free and takes place through your local council's library services. Dawn Marie, the librarian at Glenburn Library, will be visiting the school on 19th June to share more information with the children.

This is an excellent opportunity to develop children's reading skills over the summer holiday period while fostering a love of reading for enjoyment. Please support your child to engage in this. We normally receive certificates for all children who have participated when we return to school in August.

School Uniform

Firstly, thank you for your continued support in ensuring that your children attend school in full uniform and present themselves so smartly. As we begin planning for the forthcoming academic year, I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our school uniform expectations.

Why is it helpful for children to wear school uniform?

Wearing a school uniform offers many benefits to children and we encourage this as it sets an appropriate standard for children to be able to come to school comfortably while encouraging a readiness to learn. Some other benefits are listed below:

- Instils a sense of pride in the school
- Promotes a positive and professional ethos
- Reinforces the idea of school as a place of learning
- Supports positive behaviour and discipline
- Encourages equality among pupils
- Enhances safety, allowing pupils to be easily identified.

We would prefer that children do not attend school wearing brightly coloured trainers. Hooded tops should be discouraged unless they are school hoodies with the school badge. Please discourage your child from wearing designer labelled items of clothing.

Please note, we operate a school uniform bank and are able to provide brand new school uniforms to families who may require assistance. Please contact us by email and we will do our utmost to help. Please be reassured that this will be treated with the strictest of confidence.

While these guidelines reflect our preferred uniform, we recognise that parents ultimately have the right to decide what their child wears. However, we respectfully ask for your support in maintaining high standards of uniform across St. Peter's Primary School.

Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly labelled. We currently have a significant amount of lost property that cannot be returned due to missing names.

Fairtrade Uniform

We are a fairtrade school and, as such, we promote fairtrade items where we can. We are able to provide a link for you to be able to purchase uniforms which are made of fairtrade cotton. School Meals and Clothing Grant information - Are You Getting What You Are Entitled To?

The Scottish Government provides free school meals to all children in Primary 1-5. However, please continue to apply for this if you meet the criteria to ensure your child is recorded as being in receipt of free meals.

Free School Meals - Who is entitled to free school meals?

You can get a free school meals if you get:

How to apply for meals

Apply online

You do not need to apply if your child is eligible for funded early learning and childcare, they will get a meal automatically while at nursery.

You need to apply if your child **does not** get a funded place and you meet the eligibility criteria.

Clothing Grants

Parents or carers of children attending Renfrewshire primary, secondary or additional support needs schools during the school session who satisfy the financial conditions are eligible to apply for free school meals and/or clothing grants.

Who can get a clothing grant? Your child can get a clothing grant if they go to a Renfrewshire school, and you get:

- Housing Benefit
- or Council Tax Reduction.

Your child can get a clothing grant and free meals in school and meal payments during the holidays, if they go to a Renfrewshire school and you get:

- support under [Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999](#).

If you're applying for a child who has not previously attended a Renfrewshire Council nursery or school, Renfrewshire Council will be unable to process an application until your child's enrolment has been completed. This is usually during the early part of August.

It is extremely important that you continue to make this application, even though you are informed that all primary 1-5 children automatically receive school meals at present. Please take the time to do this if you consider yourself to be eligible.
