

Spring is in the air and with it some hope that we can resume some normality, in the near future. We are very grateful for the cooperation and patience of our whole school community throughout this challenging year and we will work hard to ensure the children have lots of opportunities to enjoy social interactions and fun activities with their classmates in the final term.

Having completed my annual Standards and Quality Report for the school I have had the opportunity to reflect on the immense achievements of session 2020/21 despite functioning in unprecedented circumstances. Staff, parents/carers and, importantly, children have continued to achieve great success. Some key achievements are our Digital Schools Award and being recommended as a mentor school, significant investment in our digital hardware with 40 new Chromebooks and 12 new laptops added to our existing resources, achieving RNRA (Renfrewshire Nurturing Relationships Approach) status, all children working together to raise approximately £700 (which was matched by Renfrewshire Council) for local charity Coats for Kids, one pupil being selected for Scottish Football School for his secondary education, numerous professional achievements for staff and a group of staff raising approximately £1800 for Cash for Kids by joining forces to walk/run/ride 5km every single day in March. Our fabulous PTA have supported the children to have fun at Halloween with special boxes delivered to every class, they organized an outdoor Easter egg hunt and gifted every child (and staff member!) an Easter Egg and raised money to support P7 leavers' celebrations.....and we are not finished there as we launch our whole school walking challenge and our school mascot is being created as a result of our competition for children. Rory McCall's design was voted in first place and we are full of excitement to watch this coming to life, watch this space!

Following discussion with staff, children and parents/carers we are looking forward to the next school year and building on what we are able to offer for our community here at Thorn Primary as we develop our school improvement plan for session 2021/22. Initial trends in what you would like us to focus on is the development of our outdoor space, more information about how we assess your children's progress and transparency about each class' homework policies. Thank you for taking the time to feedback your thoughts to us. We are delighted that 100% of you are satisfied with all we do at Thorn Primary, 100% believe the school is well led and managed and most importantly 100% of children are happy at school. The responses have highlighted the high regard that our parents and carers hold our school in and we appreciate the extremely positive feedback and your knowledgeable suggestions for future developments. I would ask that you pay careful consideration to uniform requirements for next year as we hopefully return to our previous excellent standard of formal uniform

I am very proud to lead such a fantastic school community and appreciate everyone's input to make this possible. Go team Thorn!
