We have had a fantastic return to school since August. The children all returned looking so smart in their formal school uniforms, thank you for your support with this. A couple of uniform discrepancies I have noted from my observations and therefore wish to clarify:

- Summer dresses should be blue check
- Grey tartan is not part of our uniform

Please remember this when purchasing future items.

All the classes have settled well with their new teachers and you have the chance to meet the teachers on Wednesday 8th September online. We will alert you separately regarding the precise details of this event.

You will be aware from our 'Warn and Inform' letter that we have had positive COVID cases in the school. We are following all national and authority guidance in relation to letting you know about these. I appreciate it is quite different to last year as the definition for 'close contact' has changed and all contact tracing is done by Track and Trace without our involvement (unless they contact us directly). I am also aware the guidance on when children need to isolate is evolving. At the point of writing if there is a case in your home you should arrange PCR testing and upon a negative result the children can return to school.

Please note that adults should still be following all COVID protection procedure as per last year. Masks must be work at drop off and pick up and you must stick to your allocated time slots, these are noted within the newsletter.

We are delighted to be able to begin to look forward and continue to improve our school to be the best we can be at any given time. As a result of our consultation with you (Parental Questionnaire), children, staff and other stakeholders our identified priorities this session, which we like you to be aware of, are:

- Introducing a new tool to help us assess, react and track our children's well being
- Improving attainment for some children, which was affected by COVID complications, by providing extra support in literacy and numeracy
- Developing our outdoor and community learning and our outdoor learning environment
- Offering Parental Engagement opportunities within health and safety guidance
- Focusing on our curriculum progression and assessment
- Collaborating with colleagues on small tests of change to further enhance our teaching and learning

We receive funding each year from the Scottish Government to help us overcome any barriers children may have to their attainment and achievement. We consult you throughout the year in various ways to ensure we consider your views on how this money should be spent in Thorn Primary. We are pleased to be able to continue to employ Mrs Wilson, Miss Easdon, Mrs McKay, Mrs Ritchie to help support the children's learning. We are also using this money to continue to have access to our online resources: the spelling programme IDL, the reading programme Reading Eggs and the numeracy and mathematics programme Sumdog and Maths Seeds.

Our entitlement to funds and support is linked to our identified needs. To help us I would like to encourage you to apply for Free School Meals and School Clothing grants if you are eligible. We are aware that P1-3 automatically get free school lunches but we would still benefit if you applied so that your entitlement is considered in any analysis of the school profile. We are more than happy to assist you with this process if required, please just ask at the school office if you would like support.

How to avoid catching coronavirus

You can reduce your risk of getting and spreading the infection by:

- avoiding direct hand contact with your eyes, nose and mouth
- maintaining good hand hygiene
- avoiding direct contact with people that have a respiratory illness and avoiding using their personal items such as their mobile phone
- covering your nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing with disposable tissues and disposing of them in the nearest waste bin after use
- following the <u>guidance</u> for <u>households</u> with <u>possible coronavirus infection</u> and <u>arranging to be</u> <u>tested</u> if someone in your household has symptoms
- making sure everyone in your household follows the <u>Scottish Government's coronavirus advice</u> as much as possible and to stay away from other people
- making sure your household follows the <u>physical</u> <u>distancing advice</u>, especially anyone in a vulnerable group

Symptoms of coronavirus

The most common symptoms are new:

- continuous cough
- fever/high temperature (37.8C or greater)
- loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste (anosmia) A new continuous cough is where you:
- have a new cough that's lasted for an hour
- have had 3 or more episodes of coughing in 24 hours
- are coughing more than usual

A high temperature is feeling hot to the touch on your chest or back (you don't need to measure your temperature). You may feel warm, cold or shivery.

If you have coronavirus symptoms

If you've developed symptoms (however mild), stay at home for 10 days from the start of your symptoms and arrange to be tested. Do not go to your GP, pharmacy or hospital.

You should remain at home until you get the result of the test, and then follow the advice you will be given based on the result.

When to get help

Only phone 111 if:

- your symptoms worsen during home isolation, especially if you're in a high or extremely high-risk group
- breathlessness develops or worsens, particularly if you're in a high or extremely high-risk group
- your symptoms haven't improved in 10 days

If you have a medical emergency, phone 999 and tell them you have coronavirus symptoms.

Do the people I live with need to take any action?

If you live with other people and have symptoms, they'll need to stay at home for 14 days from the start of your symptoms even if they don't have symptoms themselves.

If they develop symptoms within the 14 days, they need to stay at home for 10 days from the day their symptoms started and arrange to be tested. They should do this even if it takes them over the 14-day isolation period.

Your whole household should follow the stay at home guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection.





Arrival

Children with surnames A-L should arrive between 8:50am and 8:55am.

Children with surnames M-Z should arrive between 9:00am and 9:05am

The children will go straight into their classroom. They will not wait in the playground or line up.

End of day

Children with surnames A-L will finish school at 2:50pm.
Children with surnames M-Z will finish school at 3:00pm.
*If two siblings have different surnames, one A-L and one
M-Z, please follow guidance for A-L and inform the new class teachers.
