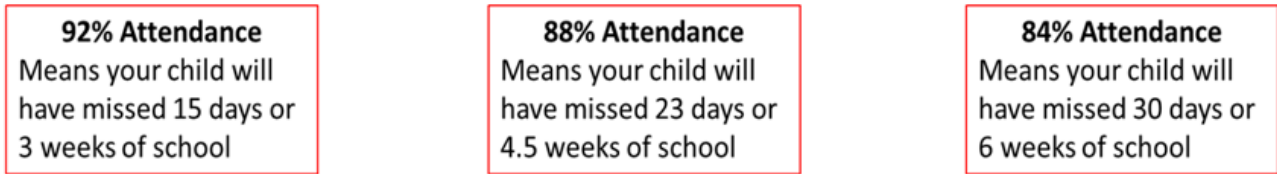


Promoting Good Attendance

“There is a system-wide concern about reduced levels of attendance since the Covid-19 pandemic. Attendance, combined with engagement should support children and young people to make progress in their learning and have a positive impact on their educational outcomes. Progress, attainment and achievements can be impacted by any absence. Evidence suggests that attendance that falls below 90% can have a negative impact on progress.”
