Dear Parent / Carer,

As we approach the end of the term, I am writing to thank you for your continued support of our school community. Since we returned after the Christmas holiday there have been lots going on in and around the school which has been a joy to see and be a part of. School Update

Pupils within the Broad General Education (S1 - S3) have continued to work extremely hard and will undertake some events during the month of May to prepare them for their transition into S2, S3 and S4. We will keep parents and carers up to date with all events taking place in the school during the summer term. We anticipate the pupils in S1-S3 will begin their new timetable on **Monday 20**th **May.**

Or Primary 7 transition programme is well underway. Staff from Trinity have been liaising with colleagues in our local Primary schools to ensure a smooth transition. There will be a series of visits from Trinity staff to our associated primary schools as well as our P7 Activity Days and Induction Days which are scheduled for late May / early June.

Pupils will then be provided with a bus to take them directly to the Prom. The Prom will conclude at around <u>11.45pm</u> with pupils responsible for making their own arrangements to get home afterwards. Mobile Telephones

Probably most of us live in a world where we are heavily dependent on our mobile phones. This undoubtedly brings benefits, but also presents us with challenge. We have tried to soften our approach to mobiles as we understand the benefits they can bring to the classroom - at the appropriate times.

However, despite clear expectations that pupils keep phones in bags, unless being allowed to use them for learning, we are still having issues over phone misuse. Teachers are reporting constant notifications from phones in pockets, on laps or in pupil hands. All of which is leading to interruptions to important learning and teaching.

Not only does this have an impact on the learning environment for all young people and their teachers, but also on the wellbeing of the individual young person as they battle to cope with the constant stream of messages and notifications coming through their phone.

Through my discussions with parents and carers I understand that you also have frequent conversations about 'screentime' and phone dependency. Recently, several departments have undertaken a pilot programme of storing pupil phones in a box at the start of the lesson and returning at the end. We are getting reports of improved engagement in learning and less disruption to classes.

Therefore, from Monday 22nd April, all phones will be handed to the class teacher who will safely store them in purposely bought storage boxes until the end of the lesson. Of course, this is not a total removal of mobile phone access: pupils will have access to their mobile phones before the start of every school day, during intervals and lunchtimes, and at the end of every school day, but this approach will allow us to create a calmer and more productive learning environment in every class for every pupil in Trinity High School.

If there is ever an urgent message you need to get to your child, please contact the office. Otherwise, they will always be able to catch up with you at the end of the lesson. There is no expectation for pupils to bring mobile telephones to school and do so at their own risk of damage etc. however if they do decide to bring a phone to school, we will ask for full cooperation of the policy above.

House Structure
