They will give an introductory phone call after a few weeks to check in to see if you have any questions.



HOUSE STRUCTURE

Trinity has recently moved to a house structure where there is a head of house (Depute Head Teacher) and a pastoral teacher working together to support the young people.



THE SCHOOL DAY

One of the biggest differences for pupils is the structure of the school day. Every day starts at 8:50am. Pupils should arrive at school before this time and be ready to start lessons at 8:50am.

You will be contacted by your child's pastoral teacher if late coming is an issue to discuss supports.

FOLLOWING A TIMETABLE

Pupils are issued a timetable for first year on their first day in the school. We would encourage them to take a photo of it in case it becomes lost.

SCHOOL LUNCH

We have a Canteen and S1 pupils use this to purchase their lunch or use the facilities to eat a packed lunch.

School lunches can be purchased through our cashless catering system. You can use Parent Pay to add money to your account. A decision about going into "town" for lunch will be made during first term and will be communicated home.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

All pupils are expected to wear full school uniform at all times. We will be working closely with parents to make sure these expectations are upheld.
