An average school year comprises 190 days, therefore.....

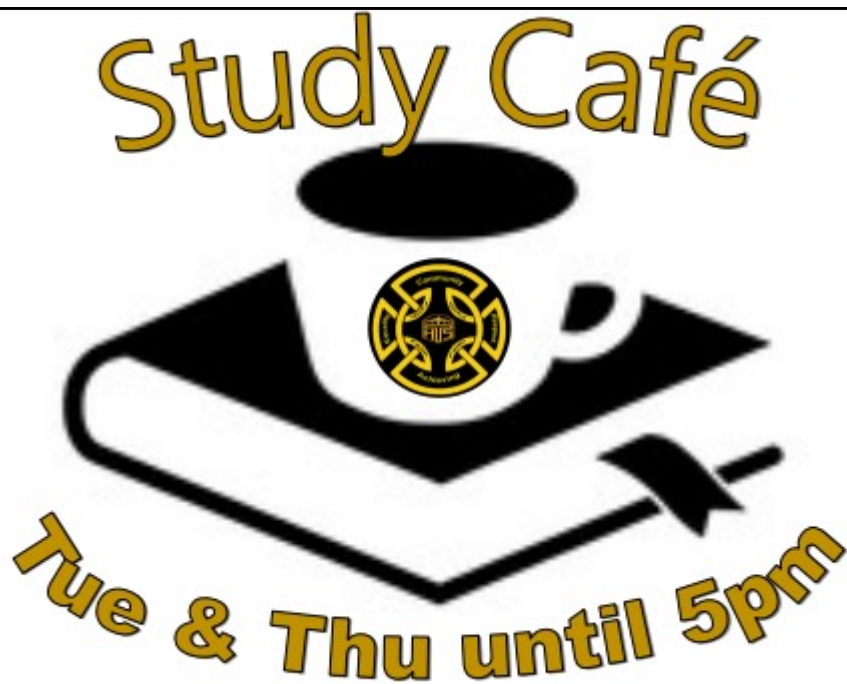
92% Attendance
