## Nut Aware

Trinity High School aims to be a Nut-Free school. The school aims to protect anyone who has an allergy to nuts.

Our "Nut-Free Policy" means that the following items should not be brought into school:

- Packs of nuts
- Peanut butter or Nutella sandwiches
- Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts
- Cakes made with nuts

## Allergy Aware School



We have a policy not to use nuts in any of our food prepared on site at our school. Our suppliers provide us with nut-free products. However, we cannot guarantee freedom from nut traces and we know pupils bring food into school from local takeaway shops therefore we need to ensure that young people are allergy aware. Fast food should not be brought into the canteen but can be consumed within the social areas. Packed lunches which do not contain the items listed above and meals bought in the school can be consumed within the canteen.

**Parents and carers must notify staff if their child has any known or suspected allergy to nuts and provide all medical and necessary information. This will be added to your child's care plan.**
