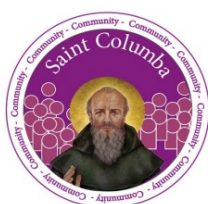

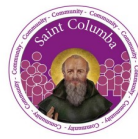

House Badge



House badges can be awarded to any pupil who has contributed positively to our school. For example:

Peer Tutoring / showing visitors around the school / volunteering at Parents' Evenings / continued effort in class (and already achieved departmental recognition). Pupils can be nominated by their class teacher or via email to the Trinity Enquiries mailbox (link on school website)

Values Badge



The school values badge can be awarded to any member of our community who has demonstrated any of our values. For example:

Community: Volunteering at local clubs / helping out in the community / good deed

Achieving: Sporting success in and out of school / academic success / personal achievement

Respect: Good deed / continuous high standards in class and already in receipt of House Badge

Equality: Supporting events across the school / representing the school at local and national events / good deed

Faith: Mysterious Tuesday / Diocesan events / school liturgies

Excellence Award (New for 2025)

This is a new award introduced to coincide with our Jubilee Year and is inspired by our motto of *Achieving Excellence Together*. The design of the badge is derived from our Traditional Logo which is described below (extract from a previous school handbook)

The Church represents the Medieval Templar Church in Inchinnan which the Templars built in the round shape of the Mosque in Jerusalem to show their link with the Holy Land.

The view, showing three sections, suggests the Trinity and reminds us that also connected with medieval Renfrew was the 'Order of the Holy Trinity', whose work was the redemption of captives.

Any member of our community, past or present, can be nominated for this award. The award is given to people who have made a significant contribution to the life of the school.
