Dear Parent / Carer,

As we approach the end of the academic year, I wanted to write to you to offer my sincere thanks for all your continued support. The letter also provides an update of events which have taken place this term and shares important information regarding our return in August.

This Session

This year has been another incredibly busy but successful academic session. When we returned in August 2025, we continued our "Trinity at 50" celebrations with a lovely Mass, celebrated by Bishop John, in St James' Church. Following this, we gathered in the hall for a fantastic reception, providing an opportunity to reflect and share memories of our wonderful school.

This session, we have celebrated pupil success across a wide range of disciplines, including academia, performing arts, sport, science, and public speaking. We have also enjoyed a variety of in-school activities such as inter-house competitions, charity events, faith retreats, and the inaugural Activities Week. Pupils and staff alike also took part in trips to Venice, Santa Caterina, Edinburgh, Glasgow, and various local attractions.

Qualifications Scotland 2026

We were delighted with how our young people approached the Examinations Diet. Invigilators visiting the school were very complimentary of the pupil engagement and how well-mannered and polite our pupils were when asked to follow specific instructions.

Results will be published on **Tuesday 4th August**. Pupils can receive their results by text or email if they sign up to My Qualifications Scotland by **5pm on Wednesday 15th July**. A certificate will also be sent by post on 4th August. There will be some staff in the school on the day results are published should you wish to telephone the school with any queries.

Senior pupils returning for next session will have the opportunity to meet with a Pastoral Teacher between **10.45am and 12.25pm on Friday 14th August** should they wish to renegotiate their options for next session.



Uniform

We believe that our uniform promotes equity, school identity, shared values, self-confidence, and a shared sense of community. School clothing grant and free school meals applications are now open. These applications are for the new school year starting in August. You could save up to £889.75 per secondary school child by applying. This total saving is for both a school clothing grant and free school meals. Apply **by Sunday 12th July** and Renfrewshire Council will process your application before the new term starts.

Anyone on Universal Credit can earn up to £995 per month and still be eligible. The Council provides holiday payments for free school meals. Payments are £2.35 per day per child. They cover the October, Christmas, February, Easter and summer holidays.
