### Funding Update

We have received some wonderful news over the last few months about funding applications for our school. Our grants sub-committee of the Parent Council has secured the following for us:

- £4,000 from Foyle Foundation for reading resources and our library.
- £2104.35 from Flight Path funding for cooking equipment.
- £2635.65 from Food for Thought for a food technology project.
- £500 from local shop Nisa for our football team.
- Sponsorship from local business Eastons Solicitors for our football team.

They were also able to organise volunteers from Intu Braehead to upgrade our atrium area, they worked with staff from Cardwell Garden Centre for two days to paint, clean, clear and plant. The area looks great and we hope we will get lots of good weather to use it. We cannot thank the parents in this group enough for their hard work in securing this funding; these grants and sponsorship will make a massive difference to the pupils at Wallace.

## Reminders

- Wallace Primary School is a nut free zone; we have children with severe nut allergies and ask that no nuts or nut products be brought to school.
- We kindly request that parents don't park in the school car park and are considerate of local residents when using surrounding areas.
- Pupils are welcome to cycle to school, we ask parents to ensure bikes are in roadworthy condition, helmets are worn and pupils have appropriate skills and safety awareness to do so. We kindly request no cycling in the school playground.
- No dogs are allowed within our school grounds.
- Pupils should bring full PE kit on gym days. Jewellery should not be worn on PE days. If earrings must be worn, they should be taped over at home or by the child at school. Tape should be provided from home, this is in line with Renfrewshire Council Policy.
