Road Safety



Renfrewshire Community Safety
Partnership have been working with
our school to help to keep our children
safe and well.

We are focusing on two important issues that affect health and safety of our children. **Dangerous parking and inconsiderate parking** causes congestion around schools and endangers the safety of children walking in, out or around the school premises.

If you are dropping or collecting your child at school, the safety team ask that you please follow these guidelines:

- Do not park on "Keep Clear" markings or yellow lines
- Do not park on zig zag markings
- Be considerate and do not stop in the middle of the road
- Do not park on pavements or across dropped kerbs
- Do not use the school car park or allow your children to walk through it

The second aspect is Engine Idling. Keeping your engine running while you are waiting near the school creates toxic carbon monoxide fumes which are harmful to children's health. Idling is against the law and carries a fixed penalty.

If you are waiting to collect your child at school, please turn your engine off.

Community Wardens have been doing spot checks near the school recently and some parents were issued with fines. The wardens will continue to monitor parking and engine idling at various times at school.
