Pupil Hubs/ Pupil Leadership

Pupils will have the opportunity to lead initiatives within the school through our hubs, which will begin after the October break. Children will have the choice as to which kind of group they would like to be involved with and will work with cross-year groups to drive forward agendas such as outdoor learning, blogging across the school, ECO issues and establishing good community links. In this way, children get an opportunity to lead an area of learning that is of interest to them and relevant to their lives but which will also benefit the whole school.

We have an open door policy to address any concerns promptly and pride ourselves on the positive relationships we have with our families. We would request that you do not use social media as a means to raise any issues but rather that you contact us directly.

Parking

We would kindly ask you refrain from parking in Rashiewood, the street immediately next to the school when dropping off/picking up your children. This area is very busy with children walking to/from school and is not a safe place to park your car. The residents of the street have also raised their difficulties they've had at times being unable to leave or enter their properties due to the area being congested. Your support in assisting us resolve this issue would be greatly appreciated.

Bike racks

Our bike racks are situated outside the Primary 5 classroom. Cycling is a great way to get to school in terms of encouraging an active lifestyle and helping the environment. We would encourage the children to cycle to school when possible. For safety reasons, all children should dismount before entering the playground and should walk their bikes out at the end of the day. Helmets should be worn. Scooters can be chained to the racks.

Water Bottles

Pupils are encouraged to bring a full water bottle to class each day and they can drink plain water throughout the day. Diluting juice, flavoured water and fruit juice can be consumed at break and lunch.



Wet mornings

If the weather is unsuitable for the pupils to remain in the playground (heavy rain, snow, ice etc) then the children will be allowed into the school at 8.50am. On wet mornings please plan your journey to arrive as near to 9am as possible.

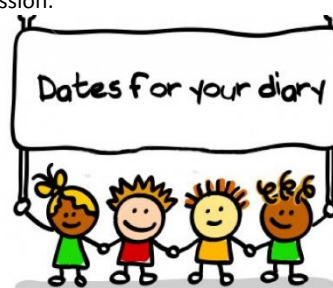
