Curriculum Matters

Literacy

Mrs Ritchie and Ms McCusker have been leading our working group on developing approaches to writing across the school.

As part of our work in the Literacy Working Party we had a meeting with Renfrewshire Council's Literacy Development Officer. She spoke to us about the new writing framework that is currently being developed by Renfrewshire Council in conjunction with Strathclyde University. Following this we applied for places on the Dive into Writing course. Two staff members are currently attending this

We decided as a group to pilot some of the strategies that the Development Officer discussed with us. One of these was the development of 'free writing' within the class. This provides the opportunity for children to write for enjoyment and develop their identity as a writer. If you ask your child about EWIC (Everyone Writing In Class) time they will be able to tell you about the things they have been writing and how much they have enjoyed them.

Learning Buddies

We have extended our literacy Buddies from last session with almost all Primary 5 - P7 pupils taking on the responsibility to lead the learning of younger pupils. They will be coached in how to teach specific skills in literacy, numeracy and health and well being in Primary 1 - 3 pupils. The learning from this whole experience will go both ways as the older pupils will consolidate their learning while introducing the younger pupils to new ideas. The teachers are very excited to see how well the Primary 5 pupils carry out this challenge and will be there the whole way to facilitate this initiative and provide the teaching and support in order for the project to be a success. Numeracy



Mrs Whiteford has been leading our working group on developing approaches to maths and numeracy across the school.

The Mathematics and Numeracy Working Party met and evaluated this years School Improvement Plan as well as the Renfrewshire Framework Maths and Numeracy Checklist. Our working group has identified four areas to develop practice within Rashielea Primary School. The four areas include:

- 1. Working Walls
- 2. Problem Solving
- 3. Number Talks within a Context
- Consistent Vocabulary

We are currently trialling new approaches within our classroom through working walls, numbers talks within a context and problem solving. We are using pupil voice for feedback and tracking the effect the approaches have on the children's learning and teaching using questionnaires. In addition, a vocabulary handbook is being created to ensure a whole school consistent vocabulary approach.

The Classroom Assistants have been enthusiastically taking part in training for Thinking Boards, Number Talks and CUBES problem solving strategies to support and enhance the pupils understanding in numeracy and maths. Teachers and pupils are enjoying using the wide range of new maths resources in classes which are providing children with opportunities to explore concepts with practical and visual materials.

Health and Wellbeing (HWB) Renfrewshire Cross country

40 of our P6 and P7 pupils participated in a gruelling 2km course and we are hopeful that our teams will be placed within the top 4.

Tammy, one of our Active School's coaches, is training the P7s and P7/6s to be playground games leaders.

Anti - Bullying Week November 12th - 16th

We have been reviewing our Ant-Bullying Policy in line with national and local authority guidelines. We are working with Brian Donnelly to gather and collate the views of our children, staff and parents/carers which will inform our new policy. Brian will also be delivering an information and discussion session for parents and carers on the evening of Monday 12th November at 7pm.

All the children will be participating in lessons relating to Anti Bullying throughout the week of 12^{th} – 16^{th} November.

Renfrewshire Nurturing Relationships Approach

Rashielea Primary has started the journey to become a nurturing school. Mrs McKillop and Mrs Steedman attended a 4 day training course and are leading our school through this journey by working collaboratively in partnership with Education Psychological services and the authority PT for Nurture to develop this approach in the school.

Supporting all staff in developing Renfrewshire's Nurturing Relationships Approach. The Nurture Group are focussing on Principle 6 - 'Transitions'. The aim is for class teachers to recognise the importance of how day to day transitions are managed as well as carefully preparing pupils for more significant changes and events. Class teachers will welcome pupils into their classroom during a soft start and do a daily check in with regards to how they are feeling. This links in with our Paths Programme. All classes will display a visual timetable which pupils can refer to so they are clear about what they will be doing during the course of a day. We believe that if our pupils are happy and comfortable in school then they are ready to learn.

Raising Attainment

As part of the Scottish Government's drive to raise attainment, our children in P1 to P3 will bring home either a Book Bug bag or a Read, Write Count bag. These are wonderful resources which should be used at home to encourage talking about learning and will be distributed towards the end of term.

See Saw

With the support of Miss Denholm we have successfully introduced the use of the See Saw app throughout the whole school after an initial trial period in P1 and P5. We appreciate the efforts Miss Denholm has put into resolving the technical issues experienced and providing Drop in sessions for parents to help them the feedback from parents, pupils and staff have all been very positive. We have found it has been a very effective way of sharing the learning and experiences that our children have on a daily basis and keeping you informed of your child's progress.
