Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to St Fergus' for our new school session 2024/25. I hope you all have had a wonderful summer holiday. The term ahead is sure to be a busy one with lots of engaging and fun learning to be enjoyed, we are so looking forward to having parents and carers being involved in their children's educational journey. We have many events and activities taking place. I am looking forward to continuing our effective partnership and I am sure this will be a successful term for all.



I would like to offer a warm welcome to our new Primary 1 pupils and their parents/carers. The children have all settled very well and appear to be enjoying their new experience. Well done for an excellent start!

I was delighted to see all pupils return to school for the new term in uniform. School uniform contributes to success in many aspects of school life and encourages pupils to develop a sense of identity and pride in our school. Uniform also means that all children are equal with regards to clothing, and they are not competing with designer labels. Could I please remind all parents that our uniform is **plain grey** and **not black**.

The wearing of uniform is something I would strongly encourage throughout the year and would like to thank all parents for their support in this by getting their children off to an excellent start. Of course, all uniforms are very similar, so it is very important that individual items of clothing are clearly

labelled with each child's name. This will help to minimise the number of items lost as this can cause much unnecessary anxiety for children and expense for parents.

### Nut Allergies

We are a nut free zone as we have children with a severe nut allergy which, for these children contact with someone who may have eaten nuts could be **FATAL**. Please always check the ingredients of your child's snack and lunch. I would ask for your co-operation and ensure that there are no nuts brought into school for snack or lunch. Please note that these ingredients can be found in chocolate spread, biscuits, cereal bars etc. Please always check the ingredients.


To gain access at the main entrance please follow the guidance at the keypad as the door cannot be operated from within the office until this has been followed.

### Parent Pay

We are a cashless school, and every child requires a ParentPay account whether they receive a free school meal or not. All new parents to our school will receive information on how to set this up over the next week. Should you need support in creating your ParentPay account please speak with Ally who can help you with this. At St Fergus' we try as much as possible to subsidise costs using school funds, however, the school recognises that families may still find it difficult to meet some of these expenses at times. I would ask that any parent concerned about expenses related to going to school, contact me. All such approaches will be dealt with in the <u>strictest</u> <u>confidence</u> and the school will always try to help.

Children are encouraged to change for PE in our changing rooms and we ask that children ensure that they have their kit with them on these days. All items of jewellery including earrings must be removed for P.E. lessons and the school cannot accept responsibility for any item which is lost or stolen.

### **Outdoor Learning**

Please remember that a lot of our learning takes place outside, in our everchanging Scottish weather, we ask that your child comes to school every day with suitable outdoor wear including a waterproof jacket. If any families are experiencing difficulties in providing a suitable jacket, please contact myself or Mrs Rowley as we are always here to help.



### Child Safety/Car Parking- Reminder

We are always concerned about our community's safety especially with regards to parking safety at the start and end of the day regarding parked cars. Could I please remind everyone of the following:

- No Parking on the yellow zigzags
- No Parking in front of our new neighbour's driveways on Bankfoot Road.
- No Parking in the staff car park unless using the disabled space. This must be authorised by the school on proof of Blue Badge.
- No parking in the drop off bays at <u>any time</u>, cones will be in place at the end of the school day to stop this from happening.
- Do not allow your children to exit your car at the entrance to the drop off zone.
- Please encourage both children and adults to use the school crossing.

Please inform anyone who is due to collect your child/children of the reminders above in the interest of keeping everyone safe. Thank you.


### **Mobile Phones**



We are encouraging children not to bring their mobile phones to school unless completely necessary. If they do, it is school policy that they are switched off on entering the playground to ensure that no pictures or videos are taken of children. Your child's teacher will request that they are handed in and stored in a secure place until the end of day. Thank you for your understanding and support with this.

### **Health Promoting School**

Last year we had an increasing number of children coming to school with juice in their water bottles, just a reminder that it is water that the children should be drinking during class time and there are 2 filtered refilling stations in the teaching area. Fruit/diluting juice should be kept for interval and lunch time.



### Team Around the Child Meetings

As part of our yearly calendar of support meetings all children will be discussed this term with regards to the Wellbeing Indicators of Safe, Healthy, Achieving, Nurtured, Active, Respected, Responsible, and Included.

During these meetings myself, Mrs Rowley, your child's class teacher and Ally, our Inclusion Support Assistant will be present for these discussions. Should you wish more information regarding this please do not hesitate in contacting the school office to arrange a suitable telephone appointment with myself or Mrs Rowley.

### **Administration of Medicine**

During any year some pupils will require to be given medication at school. Parents are asked to note the following points should this apply to their child:

- Medication will be administered by authorised members of staff at the discretion of the Head Teacher. This will only be possible when a Parental Permission Form is completed. Forms are available from the school office, when required.
- School staff are not permitted to give non prescribed medication to pupils (e.g., Calpol, antihistamines, cough medicines etc)
- Pupils requiring antibiotics should have dosage arrangements made, such that the antibiotic can be taken before and after school wherever possible.
- Medicines will be stored in a secure location not accessible to pupils. Exception to this is asthma inhalers which MUST BE READILY AVAILABLE WHEN REQUIRED. Inhalers will be kept by pupils in school bags and pupils will be self-administered as required. Supervision by school staff can be arranged if

parents are concerned about their child's ability to administer correctly. This arrangement would normally apply only to younger children in Primaries One and Two or pupils recently diagnosed.

• No pupil will be allowed to take part in school outings without essential medication. This includes ASTHMA INHALERS. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that INHALERS and other essential medications are provided. If these are not available, then unfortunately pupils must be asked to remain in school.

A copy of Renfrewshire Council's policy "Guidance on the Provision of Health Care in Schools" is available from the Head Teacher by request. The above advice, relating to practice in St Fergus' Primary school, is reflective of this policy.

### School Photographs

This Year's school photographs will take place on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September. All children will have the opportunity to have an individual/family photograph and P1 and P7 class groups. Their proof photos will be in their school bags the next day. Please note you only have 1 week to order them online to receive free delivery to the school, thereafter there is a charge and will be sent straight to your home address. The school will receive commission on all photographs ordered.

### **Bikes and Scooters**

It has been lovely to see so many of our children cycling or scooting to school as it contributes to children's general health and well-being. However, to ensure the safety of everyone entering and exiting the school playground we would ask you to remind your children to come off their bikes or scooters prior to entering Bankfoot Road.

### A Reminder from the School Nurse

Head lice can be present in a small number of children at any time. They are easily treated with prescribed lotions or removed by regular bug busting. To help keep your child free from head lice we recommend weekly bug busting with a fine-toothed nit comb used on wet hair. If no lice are found repeat this once a week. If you do discover live, walking head lice and are unsure what to do, please seek advice from the pharmacist, your GP, or the School Nurse.

# Are You Getting What You Are Entitled To?

# Free School Meals

Your child may be entitled to free school meals if:

- Your child attends a Renfrewshire school or has been placed in an educational establishment outside Renfrewshire-by-Renfrewshire Council, or
- You receive income support, any income-related element of employment and support allowance, maximum working tax credits (if you earn less than £6,420/year), child tax credit only (if you earn less than £16,190) or pension credit

# **Clothing Grants**


Parents or carers of children attending Renfrewshire primary, secondary or additional support needs schools during the school session who satisfy the financial conditions are eligible to apply for free school meals and/or clothing grants. A clothing grant is a payment made by Renfrewshire Council to qualifying parents or carers to assist with the purchase of school uniforms. For session 2020-2021, the level of clothing grant is £100 per eligible pupil. A maximum of one grant will be paid for each child during any school year.
