

Early Years Centre routine

- Sign in by adult and child at group table
- Weekly snack donation £1.50
- Child posts snack card
- Free play
- Together time
- Free play/activities
- Group time
- Home time children collected from group table and signed out











Early Years Centre Lunch

- Children are provided with a free school hot lunch.
- They are encouraged to sit together and staff model good table manners.
- Children are encouraged to try new foods.
- The lunch menu is shared with parents in advance.
- Parent's can provide a small healthy packed lunch if they think their child will not eat the school lunch. This should be placed in a disposable bag and named.
- Please do not send in a packed lunch box/bag.









Early Years Centre areas

- Playroom and Quiet room free play with natural and real life resources and toys
- Outdoor space physical play, curiosity, problem solving, literacy and numeracy
- School facilities gym hall, ICT Suite and public library
- Outdoor learning in School Eco-Garden and local area.











Play based learning

Play is one of the most important ways in which young children gain essential knowledge and understanding.

Play helps children develop many skills, including:

- Self-confidence and self-regulation
- Creativity
- Problem-solving skills
- Communication and social skills
- A love of learning
- Flexible thinking





Engaging in purposeful play experiences enhances children's mastery of academic concepts and builds interest and motivation to learn.









Parent helpers
