Primary 2 enjoyed exploring the outdoors at Culzean when they visited Dolphin House.





Parent Pay and Pre-order lunches

We have moved to Parent Pay and Pre-order lunches. These schemes have been rolled out across the whole authority. Thank you to all the parents who have already signed up. Please contact the school office if you have any issues. We would encourage all parents to pre-order their child's school lunch and also use this system to indicate if your child is taking a packed lunch. Children in P1-5 receive a free school meal to the value of £2.35. This consists of 2 courses - starter and main or main and pudding. Children can order 3 courses but the difference will be taken from your Parent Pay account. We appreciate your patience as we embed this new system.



Extra Curricular Activities

We have had another busy term in terms of our extra-curricular activities. The children have enjoyed a range of activities, including netball, athletics, basketball, chess and choir. A huge thanks to the staff and

parents who volunteer to run these activities! A thank you once again to Mr Hall who has shown great dedication in running our P6/7 football teams, they have had great successes this session, and we wish them the best of luck in upcoming matches. Schools are now required to consider the cost of the school day in order to support families and to develop a Poverty Proofing Policy to help support this. We have developed our own policy in line with Government requirements. This was given to our Parent Council for consultation and feedback. We aim to create a balance between providing experiences for children and making this accessible for all. The policy demonstrates how we aim to go about this. We would encourage parents/carers to contact Mrs Meney directly for support if required. The Young Patient Family Fund reimburses food / travel costs etc for carers of children who are admitted as **inpatients** at hospital.



School Improvement Planning

This term we are evaluating our current School Improvement Plan and will be writing a new plan that will last for 2 years. I have asked the Parent Council to consult with me regarding this. The new school improvement plan will be shared with Parents in the new term, along with our Standards and Quality Report about this session.

Our Pupil Equity Fund paperwork has been submitted. We are receiving £18,375. The plan has been submitted with the money going towards school assistant hours within the school in order to support and challenge pupils.
