



P1 Behaviour Guide



At our school we use positive behaviour management to encourage and reward children for making the right choices in their behaviour. This is based on the values of our school which are respect, co-operation, equality, honesty & responsibility.

Alloy is a Gold Rights Respecting School and our class charters underpin behaviour management in classrooms. These charters are created and agreed by the children.

In Primary 1 our class charter is -

Article 31: *We have the right to play*

We as children respect our rights by:

- Sharing with others
- Being kind
- Letting others play in our games
- Looking after our toys

Adults respect our rights by:

- Giving us toys to play with
- Teaching us how to share and look after toys in and outside the classroom

Article 28: *Every child has the right to education*

We as children respect our rights by:

- Listening carefully to the teacher
- Working hard in class
- Helping others if they are stuck

Adults respect our rights by:

- Teaching us fun lessons at school
- Helping us when we are stuck

Article 24: *We have the right to be safe*

We as children respect our rights by:

- Using items in our class responsibly
- Walking sensibly in the class and corridors
- Using kind hands and playing gently in and outside the classroom

Adults respect our rights by:

- Having a safe and tidy classroom
- Looking after and listening to children that are hurt or upset

Playground Charter

Our playground charter below is shared with all pupils and staff to ensure children are respectful of each other's rights in the playground as well as in class -

We have the right to play - Article 31

- We will play by the rules and allow others to join in our games.

We have the right to be safe - Article 24

- We will use playground equipment sensibly and treat others as we would like to be treated.

We have the right to be heard - Article 12

- We will be honest, listen to others and speak respectfully.

We have the right to medical care - Article 6

- We will play sensibly, help others and accept help when we need it.

Rewards for Positive Behaviour

- Positive recognition for making the correct choices will be given through verbal praise in class and around the school.
- Individual and group points are given in class.
- House Points are given in class and throughout the school.
- Stickers and Certificates are given to pupils as rewards.
- Good behaviour is celebrated on Friday afternoons in classrooms through Masterclass.

Disrespectful Behaviour

Children are rewarded for making positive choices and showing respect however if disrespectful behaviour continues, teachers will take appropriate action. This may include individual chats to support pupils, contacting parents and informing senior management in order to support children in making the right choices.
