Primary 4W Term 3 Learning Journey

Literacy

We begin term 3 with our Scottish Fortnight where the children will learn to recite the Scots poem "Mrs Nae Offence". This culminates with our Burns poetry competition on Friday 26th January.

We will be developing our reading skills by answering and creating a range of different types of questions. We will develop our Higher Order Thinking skills by using Blooms Taxonomy.

Science

We are learning about sounds and vibrations and will participate in practical investigations to see how sound travels.

We are learning about the Jewish and Islamic religious texts, the Torah and the Qur'an. We will be comparing these special religious texts to the Bible and will discuss how these books are important to religious people around the world.

Numeracy and mathematics

We are developing our understanding of time and most of us will be telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes. Some children will begin to explore 24 hour time. In our money topic we will be developing our understanding of coins and notes to make change as well as creating an enterprise where we will learn about how a business works.

As part of Scottish fortnight we will be developing our mapping skills. Safer Internet Day is on 6th February this year and we will be learning about the importance of understanding our digital footprints online.

Interdisciplinary Learning

To start 2024 with a bang we are celebrating Scottish fortnight, where we will learn about Alexander Fleming, Charles Rennie Macintosh and about the importance of young people using their voice for change in Scotland (Article 12 – I have the right to have my views listened to and respected).
