P6 TERM 3 LEARNING JOURNEY

Mathematics

This term the focus is on fractions, decimals and percentages and the relationship between them. This is a deep topic which builds upon all the number skills the children have developed across the four operations. In practical maths we begin by investigating lines of symmetry and then move onto time. In P6 we apply our understanding of time to timetables to support us in real life situations and solve problems of duration. As always, times tables remains a key focus and we are aiming for fluency in all times tables up to 10. RRS Link — Articles 28 and 29

Social Subjects

We are going to be learning all about Europe, using our mapping skills to find out where places are in comparison to us. We investigate capital cities, famous landmarks, physical geography and cultural variety. We will extend this into an environmental focus later in the term, considering the impact humans can have on the environment.

Literacy

Our Scottish fortnight is a great celebration of our nationality, culminating in our Burns Afternoon on the 26th January. The children all gain familiarity with their class Burns poems 'To a Mouse' and 'Willie Wastle' and work on recitation skills. We will be investigating Scots vocabulary alongside this. We then move on to a powerful class novel, 'Oranges in No Man's Land'. This novel is set in Lebanon in the 1980s during the civil war and prompts searching discussions. Health and Well being

In PE we are doing gymnastics and some creative dance. We look forward to refining our skills and developing poise and balance. We will be creating routines in both these areas. One important focus in class this term will be looking at internet safety which is a key issue for all children. The other is peer pressure and outside influences. Within this we will consider substances such as alcohol, tobacco and vaping and their effects on the body. We continue to work on resilience and self-esteem as a key component across the year.

Expressive Arts

We will be continuing to assess the reliability of websites as we carry out online research across the curriculum in relation to our Europe topic. Also in ICT, we will learn about staying safe online and the benefits and drawbacks of social media.

In science we are finding out about sound and animal communication. This is a super topic which develops from the science of hearing (linked to our previous work on our senses further down the school) to how animals use a range of senses to communicate in particular ways suited to their species.
