
Welcome to Alloway Early Years Centre

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Early Years Centre Groups



There will be 8 groups with up to 8 children in each group. The groups will be a mix of ages.

Each group has a key worker(s).

Parents must sign their child in and out at their group table in the lunch area.

Once signed in, children will be encouraged to free play, enjoying a range of experiences set up in preparation for the children arriving.

Early Years Centre – children's routine

- Sign in by adult and child at group area in lunch room.
- Health and Wellbeing Check-In is encouraged to allow children to indicate how they are feeling.
 Staff follow up on this throughout the day.
- Free play Staff plan rich and responsive learning experiences which children can choose to visit.
- Group times happen throughout the week.
- Home time children signed out and collected from group area in playroom.





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What Do I Bring?

- There is no nursery uniform, children wear their own play clothes.
- Parents should leave a change of clothes in a bag on their nursery peg.
- Please supply outdoor clothes that can be kept in the EYC. Children have the opportunity to access the outdoors everyday, regardless of the weather.

Early Years Centre Lunch

- Children are provided with a free school hot lunch.
- Staff have worked hard to develop a homely environment in which children and staff sit together for lunchtime.
- Staff model good table manners.
- Children are encouraged to try new foods.
- The lunch menu is shared with parents in advance.
- Parent's can provide a small healthy packed lunch if they think their child will not eat the school lunch. This should be placed in a disposable bag and named.
- Please do not send in a packed lunch box/bag.



Early Years Centre areas


- Playroom free play with natural and real life resources and toys.

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Play Pedagogy



Play is one of the most important ways in which young children gain essential knowledge and understanding.

Play helps children develop many skills, including:

- Self-confidence and self-regulation
- Creativity
- Problem-solving skills
- Communication and social skills
- A love of learning
- Flexible thinking

Engaging in purposeful play experiences enhances children's mastery of academic concepts and builds interest and motivation to learn.

Each child is an individual

- Key worker develops a strong relationship with parent and child.
- Personal profile Learning Journals.
- Staff track individual progress.
- Open door policy for good communication with parents.
- Informal opportunities to discuss progress.
- 2 formal parents meetings.
- 3 termly written care plan meetings with staff.
- Written annual report for pre-schoolers.



EYC children starting the nursery in August 2024 are invited for visits. Information has been sent out.

Parents must remain with their child for these visits.

Children will be issued with an *All About Me* Booklet during these visits. We ask that you complete this with your child ready to return when they start.

The EYC reopens on Tuesday 20th August 2024 at 9.00am with full day provision.

Children starting the EYC throughout the year will be invited for a visit a week prior to their 3rd birthday. They will then receive their start date which will be the Monday after their 3rd birthday.
